#### **Domville Place**

The Tourism Subcommittee – Mary Tosswill, Roselle Crellin, Katrina Grundon, Jan Fitzgerald and I recently met with TRC representatives Sally Egan, Manager Parks & Recreation Services; Kristy Dalton, Principal Parks Strategy; Shane Hounslow, Coordinator Parks Operations South and Virginia Wacker, Millmerran Community Development Officer to discuss our proposed plans for the development of Domville Place. This was a productive meeting where we ran through the plans that MCPI have produced with consultant Eva Porter, (see pages 17 & 30 for illustrations).

Our next step is a deputation to City Hall in Toowoomba where we shall present these plans to TRC Councillors.

### **James Lister & TRC Councillors**

MCPI has requested a meeting with local State Government member, James Lister to discuss traffic congestion along the Gore Highway as it runs through town. Mr Lister will meet with MCPI on Wednesday 15 May and then attend our General Meeting at the Catholic Church Hall at 5.45pm.

An invitation to our May General Meeting has also been extended to the new TRC Councillors. There is a Council meeting that day and the Councillor attendance will depend on what time their meeting ends.

### Millmerran Community Place Plan, 2024-2027

TRC have compiled a Millmerran Community Place Plan which was presented to MCPI at the March meeting. This document was sent to all MCPI members for comment and the MCPI Management Committee are now reviewing the 17 page document as much of the information is outdated. This will then be supplied back to TRC and edits will take place as they come to hand.

### **Land & Development Property for Tender**

Recently it came to our attention that TRC had released four parcels of land for tender – Lots 8,9,12 & 13 Six Mile Road. This land was listed with Commercial Real Estate and unfortunately it was not advertised locally. It will be interesting to see how this all transpires and what will become of this land.





# Is your household prepared for a natural disaster?

Here's a checklist to help prepare for the months ahead.

### Do you have a basic emergency kit?

An Emergency Kit contains the items you and your household members would need for up to five(5) days of isolation. Your Emergency Kit should be kept in a sturdy waterproof container and updated at least once a year.

### Items to be included in your basic Emergency Kit:

Copies of important documents (i.e Drivers licence, insurance policies, birth certificates, passports), drinking water, non perishable food, baby formula, wipes, nappies, pet food, can opener, medications & aids (this includes prescribed medication, copies of prescriptions, EpiPen, batteries for hearing aids), first aid kit, mobile phone & charger (include a fully charged power bank), portable battery powered radio, torch, batteries, gloves, cash & bank cards, spare warm clothing, toiletries & bedding.

### Additional Items for your home:

These items are to be in your home but not needed as part of your evacuation kit.

Cooking equipment (If you are without power you may need a gas cooker or outdoor bbq), Tarps & rope (these may be needed during severe weather if your home is damaged) and copies of photos & mementos ( scan and save important photos, documents, emails and records to a USB and include them in your kit in case the originals are damaged).

### Additional Items for when you must leave your home:

These items are in case it is no longer safe to remain in your home.

Books, games or toys for younger family members, Checklist of valuables, photos, and mementos to collect before leaving and if you are evacuating with pets please make sure you have leads and cages as you are responsible for keeping your pets properly restrained.

### "I AM" the Good Shepherd

Twice in John Ch10, and only a few verses apart we read Jesus referring to himself as not just a shepherd, but a good shepherd. If we read the whole passage (John 10:7-15), it includes our "I AM" from last month (The Door) and we will read the reasons



why Jesus is a good shepherd, as he explains what a good shepherd is and what he does for his sheep.


Firstly, the good shepherd gives his life for his sheep. We saw this last month, presented in him being the door of the sheepfold. His willingness to protect his sheep with his own life is what makes him more than just a regular shepherd. An "hireling" is someone who fills the place of the true shepherd. The hireling is hired to do the work of a shepherd, but because the sheep don't belong to him and it's just a job, he isn't willing to die for these sheep and will flee, or run off at the first sign of danger to his life. The hireling has more concern for his own life than the life of the sheep he's being hired to care for, which separates him from being a good shepherd.

Secondly, the good shepherd has a relationship with his sheep. As the verse above says, the good shepherd knows his sheep and "am known of mine". The sheep know their own shepherd. The sheep that belong to the good shepherd have a relationship with Him. Sheep have poor eyesight, so it isn't the look of the shepherd but more the sound of the shepherd that they're accustomed to which makes them feel safe. They trust his guidance, and follow and obey his leading, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me" (v27).

Jesus was speaking a parable here in this passage where he calls himself the Door and the Good Shepherd. He was teaching mankind that He will be both these things to those that desire to have a relationship with Him. The parable begins in v1-6, and the key lies in those opening verses. There is only one way into the sheepfold, and that is by the door. Jesus Christ is that door. To get into that sheepfold some other way is the same as a

thief and a robber. A thief or a robber doesn't deserve, nor has earned the right or the privilege of owning what is within the fold. The sheepfold pictures salvation. For a sheep to be safe from harm, there was only one way into the fold through the door. This is why Jesus calls himself the door. There is only one way to be saved, and that is to enter in through Jesus Christ the door. The only way to get to God is through Jesus Christ. "Jesus saith... I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." (John 14:6) Many people want the peace and security of heaven, but the only way to receive that privilege is to ask Jesus Christ for the salvation within the fold. Once inside, the relationship with the good shepherd can begin, and forever we can remain as a sheep under His love and care. If you are not yet in the fold, the door is still available to all. Enter in by faith and receive the care of the good shepherd.

### What is Christianity?

Hi Everyone! It's so good to spend time with you again through this page. I've been thinking of guestions that may be important to you. So, our question this month is, What is Christianity?

So what is it? It's about relationship and not religion. God wants to be real in our lives. Christianity's about having a very tangible relationship with God with real and personal experiences together. Religion, on the other hand, puts all the emphasis on our effort, our struggle, trying to do better in life, trying to be a better person. When really God's idea of Christianity has to do with the fellowship, interaction and connection that He wants us to enjoy with Him.

I want to share some thoughts this month that I hope will inspire and encourage each of us to want to experience for ourselves a deeper more meaningful relationship and connection with God.

Everything God did for us in Jesus Christ was for us to have a relationship where we could actually hang out with Him. The fact that Jesus would cleanse us from all sin and remove the barrier of sin to make that possible. is the most incredible demonstration of love ever.

In Matthew 11:27-30 we find this beautiful invitation from Jesus to participate in this amazing relationship, 'Jesus resumed talking to the people, but now tenderly. "The Father has given me all these things to do and say. This is a unique Father-Son operation, coming out of Father and Son intimacies and knowledge. No one knows the Son the way the Father does, nor the Father the way the Son does'.

If we were to stop reading right there, we'd say, see Jesus walked in a special relationship with God the Father that's not available to anyone else. However, thankfully, Jesus goes on to say, 'But I'm not keeping it to myself; I'm ready to go over it line by line with anyone willing to listen. 28-30 "Are you tired? Worn out? Burned out on religion? Come to me. Get away with me and you'll recover your life. I'll show you how to take a real rest. Walk with me and work with me-watch how I do it. Learn the unforced rhythms of grace. I won't lay anything heavy or ill-fitting on you. Keep company with me and you'll learn to live freely and lightly." (The Message).

Wow! What an invitation? That's real Christianity! God didn't save us just to save us from hell although, thank God, that's part of it. God created us for fellowship and times of interaction with Him. And that's not just when we get to heaven but that's right here right now.

If we take to heart the words of invitation in these verses, we can see how much Jesus is calling us to fellowship throughout each and every day. And I love how He says He's not keeping this kind of relationship to Himself but is ready to share every detail with us. God really does want to hang out with us! And if we accept His invitation, we get to experience Him personally as a best friend through all our days.

But perhaps you're a little uncertain about God's love. Perhaps you weren't well-loved growing up or someone told you, "I love you" and then betrayed you. Or perhaps you've been treated badly and instead of understanding love, your life has been based on suspicion and pain. But that's not how God wants you to live.

No matter what has, or hasn't, happened in your life, I want you to know: you are still perfectly loved by the Most High God. His love for you will never fail; never stop (1 Corinthians 13:8). No human has ever loved you like that! God's love never changes toward us because of something we do or don't do.

Doesn't that warm your heart? Anything that weighs you down with effort, concern, shame or condemnation isn't God. How do I know? Because Jesus said I'll not give you anything heavy or ill-fitting but it'll be light and easy. Everything about being with Him gives us peace and joy and hope. Don't you want a relationship the way Jesus wants it? I know I do. I think you do, too.

Know I am praying for each of us that as we open our hearts and minds, God can be even more real to us.

Matthew 11:27-30...Jesus' invitation to all...yes to every single one of us!
