

Considering healthy choices for the world and ourselves at Millmerran Kindergarten

At Kindy, we're beginning to think about the 5 Rs of Zero Waste Living: Refuse, Reduce, Reuse, Recycle and Rot. This led us to make paint by sorting our old textas by colour and leaving them in water to drain the last remaining ink from them. This made us lots of paint so we could have fun making beautiful string artworks.

When our teacher noticed we had a lot of different coloured plastic texta lids left over, she asked, "What can we do with these so we don't waste them?" A Kindy friend responded, "We could make a rainbow!" Many of us liked the idea. We used the iPad to research the order of the colours in a real rainbow. Again, we went about sorting the texta lids by colour and took turns to carefully glue arcs of coloured texta lids across a big piece of cardboard. You can see the rainbow we created below.

The rainbow will be displayed at Kindy and help us to not only learn about reducing our waste, but also about making healthy food choices by 'Eating the Rainbow'. As we come to understand the ways that the different colours of food support our bodies, we will create a special recipe book, undertake experiments and make food art masterpieces that we'll look forward to sharing with the community at the upcoming Health & Wellbeing Expo.

Mayor's Repor

TOOWOOMBA

Bold ambitions



As you would have already heard, I am retiring on 21 July and the reality is, I will be retired by the time you read this. It was a hard decision for me to make eight months before the end of the term but I've done it this way so there is no financial impact on ratepayers. This is a similar process to what Brisbane Lord Mayor Graham Quirk did on his retirement. It will mean, as you would have already seen, that the current Deputy Mayor will be the temporary Acting Mayor and a vote has been taken in the boardroom immediately post my departure.

As you would know, in 2008 when the amalgamation took place, my world changed dramatically. I initially tried to travel but my real home is 102kms from Toowoomba and I found it impossible to travel up to seven days a week and attend meetings as the then Deputy Mayor. I was given temporary accommodation support and soon after that I rented a house in Toowoomba before purchasing a villa. In May 2009 my late wife was diagnosed with MND so there was a greater need to be in Toowoomba as close as possible to medical services.

It is my strong belief the amalgamation was extremely challenging for smaller communities such as Millmerran and Cecil Plains. As organisations of any type and size grow there is always a tendency to centralise to gain efficiency. I look back on the early days of my involvement and thank the great leaders like Viv Saal and George Ezzy for their commitment and love for their community. The people around the board table were a team who did the best they could for the Millmerran Shire. It was another former Shire Chairman Reg Whitbread who sowed the seed in my mind after he took me aside for a chat in the Main Street of town. Like Viv and George, he gave so much. I'd like to thank my good friend Roy Flynn for being the CEO out there during my tenancy as the Millmerran Mayor. He did an amazing job and showed great love for his community.

A lot has been said and written regarding the legacy of my era in local government. In Millmerran the advent of Yallambee, which began prior to me being elected, was an enormous boost to our local economy. Then came the construction of the \$1.3 billion Millmerran Power Station which has provided tremendous employment opportunities.

In Toowoomba, water security post the horrible debate regarding the use of recycled water was a difficult time. The sensible outcome of constructing the Wivenhoe Pipeline has been a great outcome, giving us water security for the next 50 years. The Toowoomba Bypass, which had been looked at and wished for, for over 50 years has made a significant difference. The purchase of land to ultimately become the business centre of Highfields, a community with 14,000 people which makes it the size of Warwick. Flood mitigation work we did post the 2011 floods together with \$850 million invested in the CBD, principally by the private sector, also tells the story of a vibrant Region. The internationally capable airport is a vital part of the Region's future. The Toowoomba Region generated \$11.6 billion Gross Regional Product in 2021/22 and that ranks third in Queensland. We are planning for future growth with an expected 66,000 people coming our way by 2050. The liveability of our Region is underpinned with great health and education capacity.

One of the powerful things that has happened in my time is the ability we've had to work together in groups like the Council of Mayors South East Queensland (COMSEQ), bringing the 2032 Olympics our way as well as possible fast rail and regional infrastructure. Following the success of COMSEQ I brought a group of Mayors together from west of Toowoomba. With the growth we are expecting and the jobs associated, we need housing and that's a real problem not only here but also into the far west to places like Quilpie.

Recently I was asked to hand out prizes at the RM Williams Polo centre at Hodgson Vale. RM's son Mike (formerly my Deputy Mayor) and his wife Jo have done an amazing job in developing an equestrian training centre for young people to upgrade their skills. With the possible establishment of a quarantine centre for animals at Wellcamp Airport I personally believe we stand a chance of having Olympic events here. Equestrian is massive in the Region, from Pony Clubs to horse racing and all the breeding. It's a serious industry that means a lot to our economy and is well worth a shot.

I hope when I've had a break I can help with the future of our community. I'd love to add a Camp Oven display/museum to attract people to stop and spend money in our town. The concept of a 'Big Cotton Ball' in Cecil Plains would also do wonders.

As you would have picked up there is a degree of sadness after all these years of commitment, but I owe so much to those who supported me, including my friends and family and in fact all those who've had confidence in my leadership. I have had a long absence from my real home and I'm looking forward to Millmerran sunrises and sunsets and seeing my Angus cows grazing peacefully nearby. I am honoured and immensely proud to have been so involved in advocacy for Millmerran and TRC as well the broader region. I look forward to a good rest and then enjoying a far more relaxing future. Thank you to the former Millmerran Shire for your support over all these years.

-Preventing life threatening wildfires

-Rejuvenate local flora & protect native animal habitats -Preserving tree canopy, which is important for maintaining shade, protecting vulnerable canopy animals from ground predators, providing a refuge for animals during fire and reducing carbon output (as large

canopy fires release mass amounts of carbon into the air). -Triggering seed germination providing regeneration of grass and plant species helping hold soil together and providing a source of food for native animals as well as livestock

-Providing natural medicinal benefit for animals, such as wallabies and birds who bathe in cool ash to cleanse themselves to get rid of lice -Introduced species, for example grasses, are not fire-resistant and can be removed with fire instead of chemicals



The Museum's pioneer village comprises vintage 19th and 20th century structures that range from the 1897 St Mark's Presbyterian Church from Kooroongarra to our old School house, which was built at Back Creek as the Millmerran Provisional School in 1911. There is the Lavelle Hall with its treasure trove of memorabilia, the Kooroongarra Post Office, Shepherd's Hut, Shearing Shed, Water Baby Exhibition, the extraordinary Ron Houston Collection, and the old Millmerran Shire Council offices.

Given the serious decline in volunteer participation, a situation universal to many not-for-profit organisations, we are at a critical crossroads with regard to the future of the Millmerran Museum. Whilst we receive an annual budget from Toowoomba Regional Council to cover repairs, maintenance, rent, etc. we urgently need to find alternative ways to undertake the cleaning and preservation of our many buildings and artefacts - at the high standard previously employed by willing and able volunteers. Proudly, we can assert that Millmerran's Museum is not only "one of the best in Queensland" but one of the cleanest and most organised, and we would like to keep it that way.



Death would have to be one of the greatest things that people tend to fear in life. No-one really likes to talk about death, yet we all know its coming one day. Now death can be a morbid thought, but it doesn't have to be a fearful thing. Man often fears what he doesn't know, but we've no excuse to not know about the choice we all have that impacts our eternal destination. God has always given man opportunity to know and choose their destination.

In our verse to the right, David speaks of how he fears no evil. David often faced situations in his life where he was threatened with death, but he didn't fear it. To David, death was a shadow. A shadow is something that looks like the real thing, but in reality it's not. David knew that when death did come, His Shepherd would lead him through that valley. He had the confidence to say he wouldn't fear any bad or evil thing to happen to him when that time came, because his Shepherd would be with him. What confidence! What assurance he had of his place of eternity after his death! Can you say that about your eternity? Of course we can be afraid of the dying part, but we need not fear death. Is not death just a transition from this world into



the next? For the saved; those that have repented of their sin and asked for the blood of Jesus Christ to save them from the penalty that is upon us all for our sin, we can get excited about where we are going. If we've put our trust in the death and resurrection of Jesus alone for our salvation, it is all we need. We can never do enough good things. We will never be able to be righteous enough through our good deeds - the Bible tells us so. But praise God that He sent His Son Jesus to die in our place, so that we don't have to pay our own penalty. When we accept this fact and through the prayer of faith, apply it to our soul, we need not fear the valley of the shadow of death. Like David, we can know with full assurance that God will be with us through it then, just like He has been in the past. This is why it is so important to have that day-to-day relationship with God. It is only by staying close to His voice, and following the example of Jesus that we will deepen our faith and trust everything God has to say, through the Bible. If you cannot say with confidence that you know where you will be when you face death, please talk to me, and allow me to show you how you can. God has made it simple, and has given us today to choose His way.

Goliaths!

Hello Millmerran! Let's look this month about what I call Goliaths in our lives. We've all experienced or may even be experiencing at present problems or issues in our lives that seem insurmountable to overcome.

If you went to Sunday School you probably learnt about the story of David and Goliath. Let me ask you, Did David face something big? Did he overcome it? Yes and yes. This story is not a fairy-tale or merely an historical account but has been persevered for us so we will know what to do when big ugly stuff comes up in our lives.

In Samuel 17 the Philistine armies gathered against the nation of Israel. And a Philistine champion named Goliath came out and taunted the army of Israel day and night. Now this Goliath was 3 metres tall. That's big! He really was a giant. The sheer size and weight of his armour was enough to make David quake in his boots.

Goliath challenged the army of Israel to send one of their best to fight him...but no-one volunteered (1 Samuel 17:10-11). Goliath continued to taunt Israel day and night for 6 straight weeks. His emotional bombardment was so overpowering, it crippled the Hebrew soldiers. And isn't that what the Goliaths in our lives try to do? By speaking to our mind and emotions, they seek to incapacitate...if we will listen to them.

The army of Israel were immobilised for 40 days...until a courageous young man named David showed up. Someone who trusted God.

You may be facing a Goliath who's yelling and screaming defeat at you, You're not going to make...You're going down this time! When you find yourself under that kind of assault, it's time to rise and fight. It's time to take the giant's head off!

What immobilised Israel was not Goliath's imposing size or the weight of his weapons. It was his threats. Yes, the Goliaths of life will speak...problems, symptoms, lack, will try to speak to you. And if you listen to them, you will become, as Israel did, dismayed and greatly afraid.

So a word of advice...don't get into to murmuring or complaining about the problems you are facing. Why? Because murmuring and complaining make the problem, the challenge, the symptoms, centre stage in our lives and minds. It makes them the centre of attention. Murmuring and complaining about the giant you're facing is to side in with it.

So how are we to respond to life's problems and challenges? Here was Israel staring up a 3 metres of fighting machine bad to the core. And how does David refer to him? David calls him *an uncircumcised Philistine*. What's the significance of that? David was saying, Goliath has no covenant with God, no connection to God and therefore will receive no help from God. In effect, David was saying, this giant is a nobody. A nobody against a child of the living God.

Well, you might say, what I'm facing isn't a nobody or a nothing. But the more impressed you are with what's facing you, the further away from getting free from it you are. Faith isn't in awe of how big, how terrible or how debilitating your situation is. Faith is in awe of God..in awe of the One who provides a way out, in the Healer, Protector, the Deliverer.

David didn't talk about how big Goliath was or anything like that. David instead reminded himself of the faithfulness of God (1 Samuel 17:34-37). Acknowledging the faithfulness of God in your situation will give you courage.

How do you overcome and defeat even the biggest, most frightening, toughest problems and symptoms and challenges? You do it the same way David did...believe what God promises you in His Word, the Bible, and declare it boldly out of your mouth.

You, too, can win over any giant that dares to confront you. Before David ever moved near Goliath's shadow, he has something in his possession with which to fight Goliath. Arm yourself with the truth of God's Word. It will stand you in good stead to win every time.

David didn't talk about how big Goliath was. He talked about how big His God is and what He is faithful to do.


