Proposed Cattle Creek Wind Farm

RWE is proposing to develop a wind farm and Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) near Dunmore. The proposal is in the planning and development phase and we plan to submit a Development Application later this year. The project\(\text{\subset} \) Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation referral has been submitted.

Much of Australia's grazing land is comprised of woodland where trees and native pastures coexist. In these ecosystems, trees and pastures compete for water, nutrients and sunlight, but there is also a mutually beneficial relationship between trees and pastures provided the balance is right. The interaction between trees and shrubs and native pastures within grazing systems is known as the tree-grass balance. When a favourable tree-grass balance exists, trees provide shade and shelter for livestock and support biodiversity. They also carry out key ecosystem functions, such as water

Tree-grass balance

and soil nutrient cycling, and contribute to healthy land condition by preventing erosion and salinity, storing carbon and enhancing soil condition. There is increasing recognition of the role woody vegetation plays in grazing land ecosystems which has led to demand for woodland management that is both sustainable and compatible with broader environmental issues.

A changing landscape

Woodland density and structure is constantly changing due to climatic variation and other disturbances such as fire. In many regions there is woody thickening during higher rainfall periods and thinning during drought. Where fire has been a regular feature within the landscape, the removal of fire will often lead to woodland thickening. What constitutes a natural balance is impossible to determine, what is important is establishing a balance that meets production and environmental objectives for a particular property and catchment.

Woody thickening

In extensive systems where woody thickening has occurred, mustering costs can be increased by up to 30% and production suffers as pastures compete for scarce resources. Grazed woodland ecosystems evolved with fire, which suppresses woody thickening. Without a disturbance such as fire, many land types will have a higher tree density. Management options for woody thickening. The most economic and environmentally sustainable way to control woody thickening is with fire, provided conditions such as fuel load are satisfactory. Although not without risk, the following fire management guidelines can help maintain tree-grass balance:

- -Burn every 5-6 years.
- -Have at least 2000 kg DM/ha of fuel.
- -Have fuel cover of at least 60%.
- -Burn country when timing is right for landscape species (eg. Box country earlier in year)

Bush Jottings

Spring has definitely sprung in the bush around Millmerran. The weather in October was a definite sign we are in for a long, hot summer. But the forecast is also for above average rain, fingers crossed it will be good for the farmers and gardeners but not cause any flooding.

On our bush block the wildflowers are coming out, both those native to the area and those we have planted. Even though the wattles have finished flowering, we have a "Field of Gold" with the tiny yellow button flowers. Some of the small native daisies are also common.

The Mickys (Noisy Miners) and Blue Faced Honeyeaters have found the grevilleas and bottle brushes and are busy raising babies. The Scaly Breasted Lorikeets are here in numbers and are often to be seen in the gums or at the bird bath.

Other feathered families include the red wing parrots, whose babies are drinking at our bird bath. Recently we've also seen (and heard) white cockatoos feeding their young. Pale Headed Rosellas regularly bring their babies to feed and drink. Plus of course a couple of pairs of King Parrots, the tamest of them all, who sometimes feed from my hand - they will bring their babies soon, as they have over the past 15 years.

We know our resident Pied Butcherbirds have a baby at least one baby they are feeding – it is comical seeing it flutter its wings as it gets fed. These birds have raised several generations of babies, and from dates on old photos we know we have the parents, plus two young from two years ago with their mature plumage, and two "teenagers" who are last year's brood but still have their immature plumage.

And then there are our magpie couple, who have been nesting here since we arrived 15 years ago. One year they raised three babies, but last year one of the two young must have suffered an accident and disappeared only a few days after we first saw it, just out of the nest. But we had the other one until its parents chased it out of their territory, and Mister and Mrs Maggie have built a new nest and will no doubt bring us some new babies soon.

We also have wood ducks who sometimes bring their clutches of up to a dozen ducklings to graze and visit our dam. It's amazing how, when tiny, can all fit under Mum's wings if there is danger and often wander around in single file with Dad in front

PRAYER - Is there an order? (4)

As we read the next phrase in this passage where the Lord is teaching His disciples how to pray, an interesting thought occurs... Does the Lord really need to be told or asked to not lead us into temptation? Would God actually lead a person into temptation?? Of course not would be our first response! And I agree.

But, what does this mean? Well, the phrase acknowledges the fact that we are to follow God. God is who we are to allow to lead us, while we do the following part. So, as we allow God to lead us in life, there will be times of peace & yet often times there will be dangers on either side. (Psalm 23 "he leadeth me beside the still waters" / "he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness / "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me..."). This means though that if God is leading & we are following, there will be times we'll be led into places where temptation is great, but that doesn't mean we are being led to give in to the temptation. So, although the temptation is there, & we keep following God the Shepherd, He will also lead us out of the temptation. Therefore He will "deliver us from evil". Furthermore, if we make the mistake of giving into temptation, then God is always a prayer away to ask Him to "deliver us from evil". So, it is important to follow God. This is far more than believing in the existence of God, or that He created the universe. Following God is far more than just going to church, or calling ourselves a Christian. Following God is a daily walk. It is seeking out what the Shepherd wants me, His sheep, to do in each situation. How to react; how to prevent myself from getting into sin & recognising the dangers that life brings, and yet remaining content with my Shepherd as I follow Him through life. It is about being familiar with His voice as He speaks to me from His word, & gives me peace in my heart that this is the right decision to make in whatever is going on in my life. Following God is a relationship according to His Holy Word & His Holy Spirit.

Think of Eve. She lived in a perfect world where there was only one rule to follow - don't eat of the tree of good and evil. Was she with God? Yes. Did she have a relationship with God? Yes. We don't know how long that tree stood there in the garden, but she knew the rule & obeyed what God said. Then one day, Satan <u>used</u> that tree to tempt Eve to disobey. All Eve had to do was walk past the tree, follow the words of God & that tree would never be a temptation. But when Satan got in her ear, & then into her heart, she listened, & then she saw that tree as something that was holding her back from being greater than she already was. It became something

that was stopping her from enjoying a pleasure that she'd never had & elevating her to a level she'd never experienced. And the longer she listened to the temptation, it became too great for her to handle because she stopped following the words of God & began to follow something else - her thoughts. The result was that she stopped being led past the temptation, that she had been successful at while she followed God. And she gave in to the temptation - thus she removed herself from the safety of falling into sin. While we obey God there is always an opportunity to be delivered from evil. As a believer, praise God we have the guide that will keep us from temptation - the Word of God. And praise God we have the strength to withstand temptation, & be delivered from evil - the Holy Spirit of God. When we pray, it is so good to remember to acknowledge that we need to follow God in order to overcome temptation, & be delivered from evil.

The Bible tells us the Lord, merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth and that the thoughts that I think toward you, says the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil, to give you a future and a hope (Jeremiah 29:11). God always has good for us.

The new Millmerran Multipurpose Health Service (MPHS) was officially opened on Friday 17 October

Turning of the first sod for this facility took place in May 2024 and the Hospital doors opened on Monday 19 May 2025. The end cost of the build was 28 million dollars funded by Queensland Government's Building Rural and Remote Health Program, which has provided Millmerran with an 8 bed inpatient unit, 5 bed residential aged care space, dedicated acute and non-acute areas, new Helipad, and accommodation for 2 staff. The previous MPHS facility was built in the early 1950's and serviced the community well, and now the upgraded facility will better address Millmerran's growing healthcare needs.

The neighbouring grounds of the residential aged care facility has also been upgraded as a separate infrastructure program, jointly funded by the Federal Government, Queensland Government and Darling Downs Health. Enhancements include a gazebo, barbeque area, fenced gardens, and accessible walkways designed to improve overall accessibility, enhance the experience for residents and visitors, and encourage outdoor mobility and engagement. The Arthur Ezzy Memorial Rose Garden was carefully relocated to the front of the campus near Commens Street.



The official opening was also attended by other staff from Darling Downs Health, many other invited guests, members of the Millmerran Hospital Auxiliary, Millmerran Commerce & Progress Inc. and Toowoomba Regional Council councilors - Gary Gardner, Kerry Shine and Trevor Manteufel.

All guests were provided with a sumptuous morning tea.


