Dear Local Community,

Another busy month has passed with students and staff involved in a variety of activities!

On ANZAC Day, principal Rob Michel, secondary vice-captain Brianne and primary captains, Boe, Lucas and Aira represented Millmerran State School at the Millmerran ANZAC Day service.

Josh Arnold from Small Town Culture visited to continue working on our school song and video. This has been an awesome experience for our students. We can't wait to see the finished product!

The new Industrial Design and Technologies workshop is close to being finished. This modern facility will assist students in learning the valuable skills needed for a career in a large number of trades. It will also help ensure Millmerran State School students are well prepared when continuing their studies after year 10.

Students in years 3, 5, 7 and 9 completed their NAPLAN testing. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling, grammar and numeracy. It is important to remember that NAPLAN is not about passing or failing, but about assessing learning progress. NAPLAN Online is a tailored test that adapts to student responses, providing better assessment and more precise results.

Principal Rob Michel was proud to launch STYMIE at Millmerran State School. STYMIE allows anonymous reporting of self-harm or suicidal thoughts, illegal activity, family violence, harassment or any other kind of harm. Millmerran State School is committed to supporting students to make positive choices about dealing with harm in our community. See our facebook page for more information on this fantastic program.

Prep to Grade 3 students completed a waste audit with Ms Middleton where they looked at how much waste goes into our school bins. This tied in well with visits we have had from Bec Kirby from Millmerran Landcare this year, linking sustainability discussions into our curriculum learning, specifically around reducing how much rubbish goes into bins and landfill. Our mission is to see if we can reduce our waste each week. We will call these days 'Waste free Wednesday'.



Mayor's Repor

TOOWOOMBA REGION Rich traditions. Bold ambitions.



Thanks to the team at the Historical Society for an amazing day with the launch of the 'Water Baby'. For our community this represents many things. Firstly, the preservation of some amazing history from the very early days of European settlement and the difficulties they endured. The building of such a boat by Mr Purcell would have been a big task. It was great to have his great grandson, Kevin McGrath, there to speak on the day. Secondly, the restoration by Richard, Rodney and Henry tells a story of just what can be achieved by passionate volunteers. Thirdly, there is real opportunity for Millmerran to attract visitors to see something historical and so unique that it's recognised by the Maritime Museum. Let's not forget Andy Plunkett and Greg Bowdler who found the relic on the banks of Back Creek. The book by Grant Uebergang is an amazing record and may I suggest, we in Millmerran, have gained an iconic tourist attraction.

It was great to be invited to the men's shed earlier in the month as it gave me an opportunity to gain a better understanding of what an important role these facilities can play in the lives of all of us. Seeing and speaking to some of the people there certainly reminded me of the journey we've been on with the Camp Oven concept. From my recollection, we owe a lot in those early days to Ned Winter who has so much passion and knowledge. It's always been my dream that we could gather and build a collection to have a museum which would be yet another tourist attraction, alongside the Water Baby.

We recently had a week-long exercise in Toowoomba, principally involving the Army's 11th Brigade. The relationship between the Police and the Army, in times of need, is important as was seen when our borders were closed in the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic. There was a special moment when I had the opportunity to spend time Mark Armstrong, who has a strong family connection with Millmerran. Mark is now a highly-respected Colonel in the 11th Brigade who has had a great career, not only in his non-Army work life, but he also served his country overseas in war zones.

Anzac Day always reminds me of just how much we owe these people who have served in the past and also those who are still serving our country and providing us with freedoms that make Australia such an amazing place. Anzac Day this year was an outstanding success with great crowds and plenty of young people involved. I've been fortunate to live a life without the tension and trauma of war and when I reflect, I can't help but think of those young men of my era who were balloted and attended the Vietnam War. At that stage of my life I remember the thought that we were in danger and we all had a responsibility. The terror of that war experience, together with the treatment they received from some sections of the community when they finished their two years, is something we should never forget.

During the month we had a visit from Federal Minister Mark Coulton where we had the chance to talk about infrastructure we need. We also had a serious chat about the telephone black spots across the broader region and the general IT connectivity which is beginning to impact our farming and business community.

The Olympic Games bid for South East Queensland is still on track with an announcement expected in the coming months. We continue to look for new water for the future of our Region. The grouping of Mayors which I lead is close to having the company structure in place to apply for funding to do a comprehensive study to identify future options.

There are some exciting potential industries emerging with construction of the proposed medicinal cannabis plantation which will potentially employ about 1200 staff and involve 40 hectares of shedding. It also appears a local company has developed a partnership that will put us in a prominent space in the emerging hydrogen industry. The current view is that hydrogen is the fuel of the future.



- Collecting and preparing information
- Filling out and sending NDIS forms
- Discussing disability related needs with doctors and specialists
- Providing functional assessments where needed
- Keeping track of the NDIS access request until the process is finished.

The Targeted Outreach Project and ART are both free services made possible through the Department of Seniors, Disability Services and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Partnerships in collaboration with the Australian Government.

All the bad things we do in life is called sin. When we sin, it makes us sick. We don't feel sick in



Are you ready to fight?

Many people have heard of the Bible story of David and Goliath. Even to this day, when something small wins a battle against something bigger, it is commonly referred to as a "David and Goliath" battle. Regardless of what we might remember about the story, there is so much more to glean than just the facts about a boy who was able to win a war, by defeating a warrior giant with only a stone. There are a number of things that can be illustrated by this fight, and I encourage you to read the whole story as found in 1 Samuel Ch 17. One thing that is most remarkable, is that David was unarmed. The Bible says that Goliath was "a man of war from his youth" (v33). It also says that he was a "champion" (v4). This means he was the challenger; the one that was willing to fight his own cause; a brave warrior. David was a shepherd boy; a youth, and not a trained soldier (v14-15&33). He had only come to the battle to visit his brothers on his fathers request, but stays to fight a battle that no one else was willing to fight. He was possibly the youngest, the smallest, the weakest and certainly the most untrained to be in war. He didn't have his own armour, and when he was offered some by the King, he tried it, but removed it, because he hadn't proved it to work (v38-39)

What David was armed with though, was his faith in Almighty God. That was all he needed to fight and win. Everyone around him in this battle between the armies of Israel and the armies of the Philistines were trusting in their own strength; believing in their own armour and their own ability in order to win, but not David. He saw that this was a battle that belonged to the Lord. It was not a battle that could be won physically, only spiritually. The giant problem could not be overcome with the strength and might of a trained soldier. It could only be won by being "strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might." (Eph 6:10). David knew that the physical armour offered to him would only slow him down, cause him to be impaired, and affect his faith in what he knew his God could do for him. You see, even though David went out against this giant "unarmed" in the sight of all those that were watching, he in fact, was wearing a full suit of spiritual armour. This armour would be all he needed to beat this giant of a man that the armies of Israel were afraid of. David ran into battle that day armed with the strength of his faith. He cried out the words found in the above verses, and then filled with faith he ran toward this giant and God was able to guide that stone to the exact spot that would bring down the giant problem to the point where David could do the easy bit.

Are we ready to fight the good fight of faith? Are we armed with spiritual armour to fight the giant problems that come into our life, and threaten us with their presence? They <u>are</u> too big to fight with <u>our</u> intellect and <u>our</u> ability. They <u>will</u> drain us of <u>our</u> strength and power, but this is because we aren't using the spiritual armour as listed in Eph 6:13-17, where one of them is the shield of faith. The only way to have access to this armour is to have our faith firmly placed in God. We prove our faith in God when we ask Him to save us from our sinful condition. Our sin weighs us down, and causes us to want to fight a spiritual battle with physical armour, but we cannot win that way. It will tire us out and wear us down. Let us make sure we are ready to fight with the shield of faith, for with faith we <u>will</u> win the victory over the giant. (For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our <u>faith</u> 1 John 5:4)
