<u>July 2022 Update</u> Perhaps the biggest news to come out of June was the instalment of the new community <u>LED sign in Domville Place</u>. This sign has been quite the task over four years with many in MCPI involved in making it happen. A big thank you to TRC Community Development Officer Virginia Wacker for her assistance in getting all the approvals over the line.

Originally this sign was to be situated closer to the highway however due to the relocation of the pedestrian crossing and regulations on how many metres signs are to be from crossings, this spot ended up being the only logical place for erection. Keep an eye on the sign for future community information; events; workshops; date, time, weather & significant weather/incident alerts from Council as well photos displayed of the tourist attractions in and around Millmerran.

We have been told this is effective so please give it a try.



Mayor's Repor

TOOWOOMBA REGION Rich traditions. Bold ambitions.



The recent rains and flood events seem to have eased and normality has returned. Right across our Council area we have been assessing the level of damage with our senior engineers suggesting about \$100 million is the figure. We will be seeking Betterment Funding, which is designed to improve road areas where we can get a better outcome. A full list has been sent to the State and Federal Government departments involved. I would like to see the Centenary Bridge, on the Condamine River, lifted and at the same time improve the cross drainage. It's been an issue for the full 40 years of my local government career. The highway is Federally funded but when it comes to delivery, the State Government becomes involved.

In recent times I have had a lot of calls regarding the condition of many roads in the old Millmerran Shire. There is no doubt that because of the enormity of the Region, the smaller communities, like Millmerran, may not be getting the service they expect. In the old days when the Millmerran Shire was in action the roads were graded regularly and complaints were dealt with quickly. I spent half a day driving some of the less used but important roads. Some roads have not been graded, I'm told for three years, and rate payers who use the roads are filling the holes with gravel to improve safety. There is a lot of process involved now that was avoided in the pre-amalgamation days. Maybe future Councils could consider a regional structure.

The change of government at the Federal level has seen the need for the Deputy Mayor Geoff McDonald and myself to build a strong connection with the new Prime Minister and some of his senior Cabinet Ministers. The political reality is that Millmerran is part of Maranoa. which is the safest conservative Federal seat, and the rest of our Region is in the seat of Groom, which also is a safe Liberal seat. As such, we have to get to Canberra to seek a fair share of funding for the projects we have in mind. Often this kind of funding is about pure politics, and we can't afford to miss out. On the State scene we have a similar issue however, Cr McDonald and I have put a lot of work into the State connection with some promising results. I was recently at a Local Government Association of Queensland lunch in Brisbane with the Deputy Premier where I had the chance to seek his support. I'm heading to Canberra later this month and hope the process can begin.

Recently our current CEO Brian Pidgeon was reappointed for three more years. He has had a long career in local government and he and I have worked closely together in an effort to get a better outcome in many areas. He worked as the General Manager of Environment and Community Services at Council before being appointed CEO soon after I was elected Mayor. He commenced his career at the Ipswich Council before moving here. I have a good working relationship with him which is so important.

The meeting to bring down our 2022/23 budget was held on 13 June. Our budgeted rate rise is in keeping with our long-term plan of a 2.5% increase per year and is lower than many of our neighbouring Councils that are around 4%. The Queensland Audit Office sees our financial position as being sound but we continue to need external funding. As I have mentioned before, Council has suffered a substantial loss of funding from the Federal Assistance Grants that will have a big impact on future Budgets. I'm proud of the work that has been done by our finance staff and portfolio Councillors McDonald and Shine to spend as much as possible locally. \$177 million, or 64%, of our total spend has been spent locally in the 2021/22 financial year.

As I write this report it is obvious winter is well and truly with us. Today I've opened two conferences and overcoats are all the go, particularly with those visiting from the tropical areas. It could get worse for me as I go to Canberra this month however this will be followed by a trip to Cairns when I go to speak to the Indigenous Mayors about educational opportunities available here in our Region.

It was so good attend the 100th anniversary of the first service at St Andrews Presbyterian Church in Millmerran. The whole story is one Millmerran can be proud of. Thanks to Mary and the team, who not only organised the event, but have a good record of the parish history. Thanks also to Roly Sondergeld for conducting such a great service.



Are You Sheepish?

The word "sheepish" means: resembling a sheep. How interesting that we as humans can act "sheepish". The Bible tells us in many places that we, as mankind, are all like sheep. In the Bible, mankind are likened to sheep above any other animal that God created. Our verse above is in two parts and found in Isaiah 53:6. As no word in the Bible is used incorrectly, when it says that "ALL we like sheep" it is referring to ALL of us. Yes, that is referring to you and me, along with every other person past, present, and future. When God created sheep, which he made before we came along, he made them with certain character traits. Traits that make them unique. They are made with certain things, where we have no doubt that that four-legged bag of wool running around the paddock is definitely a sheep, and we can't get it mixed up with any other animal. How can we be so sure? It is because everything about it is sheep-like. So why then, does God record in His Word that we are ALL like sheep? Well, maybe there are things that sheep do, that we do. Maybe some of our character traits are no different to those of a sheep, and God is using his wonderful creation to teach us something about ourselves.

This verse in full on the right, tells us just one of the ways we are like sheep. So, basically, it tells us a little about ourselves. It says that just like sheep go astray, and turn out of the way that they have been instructed to go, or should go, we too, are just like those sheep. We stray! It is in our character to stray from the path in life that we ought to be on. It is not uncommon for us to turn out of the way that is good for us, and get ourselves onto another path that we ought not to be on. This is something very easy to see in the character of sheep.

Now if you are someone that has never learnt to follow the shepherd's voice then maybe you have never been introduced to the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. Sadly, this would mean you are still on the wrong path. One that leads to destruction, and eternal sorrow. However, if you are reading this, then there is still time and there is still hope. You still have opportunity to be led to the Saviour and discover the importance of following His voice. The Shepherd's voice is the one that will get us onto the right path in life, and help to keep us there. But, what about you Christian? Maybe you do know the Saviour's voice, but have stopped listening. Maybe it has been a while since you have obeyed Him, and you have strayed from what is good and right. 





I want you to be encouraged today through God's Word. Jesus says throughout the Gospels, *Do not fear, Don't let your heart be troubled*. How can He say that? When you see what's going on in the world, your question might be, *How can I not be afraid*? it's so hard not to be affected and become afraid by what you hear on the news or by what's happening around you.

Because of that, I'm so thankful God has given us answers for the days we live in. When fear assaults our hearts and tries to consume our minds, there's only one place to turn and that's to the pages of God's Word. And look past the pressure, the fear, to the answers you will find there.

You see, when your mind is guarded by the Word of God, you will start to think differently, more clearly. As you think on what God says, it will work in your mind and begin to stabilise your emotions, guard your mind from the enemy's attacks against you. Go to 1 John 4:17-18 for example. I love how the Message translation puts these residence in a life of love, we live in God and God lives in us. This way, love has the run of the house, becomes at home and mature in us, so that we're free of worry on Judgment Dayour standing in the world is identical with Christ's. There is no room in love for fear. Wellformed love banishes fear. Since fear is crippling, a fearful life—fear of death, fear of judgment—is one not yet fully formed in love. Let that fill your heart. Let it wrap around you If fear is trying to grip you, If anxiety to is trying cripple your mind, it simply means you haven't yet come to know, you haven't really embraced, the incredible fulness of the love God has for you. Think about it...He loved you even when you didn't love Him. Loved us at our most unlovely. Really, what is at the root of fear is your doubt that God truly loves you. But you have a part to play. You need to focus your thoughts on God's

thoughts of love toward you...His perfect, pure, unconditional love for you. It's your embracing of the depth of God's love for you that will eradicate fear from your life.

Know that God hasn't given you a spirit of fear but of love power and a sound mind (2 Timothy 1:7).


