At Millmerran State School, we believe that all children have the right to access quality literacy instruction. We ensure that our practices involve more than teaching just reading and spelling and are also evidence based. Our whole school approach to literacy instruction provides systematic teaching across year levels, enabling students to continually build on and extend their literacy abilities. Involving all key school staff in the planning and delivery of our practice ensures consistent outcomes for all of our learners. This year, all primary classrooms have begun using the PLD approach (Promoting Literacy Development) to teaching literacy. PLD takes a synthetic phonics approach to teaching reading and spelling. PLD also targets oral language development and motor development in the younger years. Current research shows that a systematic, synthetic phonics approach to teaching literacy is best practice (Rose, 2005).

The second meeting of the year was held this afternoon. Preliminary discussion was held regarding Anzac Day with the Auxiliary catering the breakfast etc. More to follow at next month's meeting on the 20th April.

We were pleased to welcome the acting DON Helen Jones, who sat in on our meeting and provided valuable insights into all things to do with our local hospital.

It was decided that we share in this month's newsletter the tribute our President Cheryl King read at the funeral service for the auxiliary's long serving treasurer Pat Walsh (who passed away last month) for all those who were fortunate to know Pat, but were unable to attend her funeral service. As was read by Cheryl at Pat's service:

It is my honour to say a few words about our wonderful Pat and to say a bit about what she did for the hospital auxiliary but before I start, I would like to take this opportunity to express our deepest sympathy to the family.

Pat joined the auxiliary in the late 90's after Lorry passed away and almost immediately put her hand up to be treasurer – a position she held until her passing. Pat took on the role with so much knowledge, vim and vigour, never taking her finger off the pulse and never losing one cent. She worked tirelessly alongside members at golf days, clearing sales, bike a thons, street stalls, bull sales, health expos, Anzæ days, luncheons and numerous catering functions. She was very proud to raise these funds to provide medical items, gifts for the oldies in aged care, grab rails along the corridors, TV's and air conditioners. She was phenomenal at obtaining grants. We were able to get the helipad along with Jan Gainer's help, get the hospital screened and ramp to the clinic and the first automatic doors to name a few. I don't think we were ever knocked back on a grant she applied for. She just had the knack and the right words. When GST and Bas's had to be done, she took it all in her stride. It was all double Dutch to most of us and still is I might add but Pat never missed a beat. She could always answer any query put to her. Over \$270,000 was raised and spent during Pat's tenure as treasurer and it was a phenomenal effort to keep track of all that money. Pat also used to take her keyboard to the hospital where she played so the oldies could enjoy a sing along. She made song books with all the old songs in them. These books were used at the hospital, respite and seniors so there was never an excuse not to sing! She was a woman of many talents.

Pat also volunteered with me for Blue Care, as a matter of fact she persuaded me to become a member. She was on the committee and auxiliary and worked hard to help raise money for them. She volunteered at respite on a Wednesday, getting the clients morning tea and cooking them lunch, sometimes for up to 15 clients.

Pat's passing has left a giant hole to be filled and a wonderful friendship lost! Before I finish, I would like to thank Julie for all you did for us over the years auditing our books and helping Pat and since Pat's diagnosis getting the Bas done and the books up to date for us. We really appreciate it

Millmerran Commerce & Progress Inc.—April, 2021 Reportso much has happened in the past month—Millmerran Show—a fantastic effort by everyone involved, thankyou to all the volunteers for giving us this great yearly event. An opportunity for the community **b** showcase their talents, and exhibit their products. The newsletter is jam packed each month now with our various organisations events, activities andmeetings, not like last year (2020) when we were all affected by the pandemic for these things that we had planned and carried out for years. Lets hope there is no more restrictions like 2020. This month MCPI has lodged 2 grant applications. One with Toowoomba council for an AED 24/7 for the business district of Milmerran and the second with Gambling Community Benefits Fund for a replacement town signboard in Domville Place with a Led Digital Sign and if funding permits a Banner Pole to display banners. A letter of support has been supplied by Toowoomba Council Parks and Recreation for the Digital Sign board and we should have some news about this grant in July, 2021.

Millmerran Art Feature—our stand at the show had some interest from members of the community, James Lister and other show stand participants. Some suggestions were provided to the Tourism Sub Committee and further ideas have come forward since the show. It was decided tohold off on the grant application with Council's Economic Development grant until the next round in July, 2021—when the sub committee has had time to discuss the suggestions and get some quotes from landscape architects/artists to produce concept plans.

Millmerran Aquatic Centre—what exciting news has come from Toowoomba Council—6 million dollars has been allocated to the building of a NEW pool in Millmerran. Community consultation has indicated—50 metre pool other improvements highlighted by the community, shade structures, removing deep diving end of the pool, better lighting, extra swimming lanes, more water play options and better heating to maximise usage.Ideas will go forward, Tender process will take a few months- final design and costings back to Council. Construction will begin after these processes and full closure of the facility until late 2022. Council is working on plans to lessen the impact of the closure- for more information visit www.tr.qld.gov.au or phone Council on 131 872.

Caravan parking, new line markings and 4P signs are to be progressed by Council over the coming months to Campbell Street—Rams Head side and Campbell Street—Anzac Park side. This should make it easier for cars with caravans, Recreational vehicles and cars with trailers to park in that locality of the business district for a period of 4 hours to explore what our shops, pub, food outlets and take the Millmerran Heritage Walk—see some of our cultural heritage buildings and read the plaques, discover our Historic Heroes—in Domville Place.

News from Principal Engineer Drainage Planning for Toowoomba Council have advised—engaged a consultant to look at different concepts to mitigate the overland flow issue in Millmerran, approach to Queensland Rail—detention basin between Station and Rutledge Streets., Queensland Rail—advised they do not have any future plans for this land, but will check with other state departments to ascertain if they require this land., Council consultants have been instructed to do their CONCEPT designs to incorporate the detention basin.—advice these concept plans will be ready by April, 2021., Council will forward these concept plans to Denys Kirby President of MCPI for his comments as soon as they receive the plans.

traditions. Bold ambitions.

From all reports the 2021 Millmerran show was a great success. Many of my colleagues came back with good reports and I really enjoyed what I saw on my visit. I'm told crowd numbers were up and the additional events like the campdraft and the World Bullock Riding Championship have the potential to grow and attract bigger and better crowds in years to come. Congratulations to President Vanessa and all her team on a great effort.

As you would know this is my last term in local government and I often reflect on how it used to be when I was first elected to the Millmerran Shire Council and had the honour to work under amazing leaders such as Viv Saal and George Ezzy. Pay levels were such that their responsibilities in those days were discharged in a very sacrificial way. How the world changed at amalgamation with the loss of identity in our small communities and the need for bodies like Chambers of Commerce and Progress Associations to come forward in every community to deal with the "very" local issues. Can I assure you it's a very different world to be involved in now, particularly with the new act and in some cases the constant reporting to the authorities. It has become vital that the bodies formed to represent each community do just that.

You are no doubt aware that a new pool is to be built to replace our current pool. The pool first opened in the mid-1960s and has come to the end of its life. Council looked at a series of options including a housed 25 metre pool but as a result of community consultation we will get a new complex. It's yet to go through the procurement process however it appears the pool will be closed for one summer during construction.

As I write this newsletter, I am preparing to join the Mayors in SEQ on our yearly two-day visit to Canberra. We will focus on getting money for vital projects from our Federal representatives and as always, we meet both sides of the government. This year there will be a clear focus on infrastructure funding given the studies we collectively have done and the possibility of our region hosting the 2032 Olympic Games.

There's no doubt things like the fast rail would be so important for us all. We will all benefit from the residual infastructure as has happened elsewhere in the world. The sports that are possible in our Region include mountain biking, equestrian, shooting, football, archery and some are even suggesting white water rafting in a purpose-built course on our escarpment. The financial model for modern Olympics is revenue neutral. The concept is six years old and we must move swiftly as the games are a short 11 years away.

I regularly speak of the compassion there is in the community and this was evident at a recent fundraising lunch for Protea Place. It's an organisation that has its headquarters in Toowoomba and has chosen to look after ladies who find themselves in difficult situations. Typically, they're in about the 50 years age group and find themselves homeless, single, living alone with their children having left the family.

Protea Place is working with these people to rebuild their lives. They give them a place where they can come and wash their clothes, clean up and gradually get back into society. At the fundraising lunch Melinda Schneider, the singer song writer performer, was the guest speaker and mixed her life story with her very thoughtful wellpresented music. Protea Place was the brainchild of a lady called Amanda Dalton and it's my intent to do what I can do to support her and the team as they expand their services into Oakey.

Recently at a TSBE function I delivered my annual State of the Region address and the figures for the first time in many years showed a decline in the Gross Regional Product. We had been growing by an average of almost 4% per year for as long as I can recall. The figures only represent a few months of the COVID-19 pandemic so the decline is most likely the impact of the completion of big projects like the bypass. The broader Toowoomba Region's economy is strong because of its breadth. It's reasonable to expect that our recovery from the pandemic will be rapid.

As I prepare this, I have received news of some good but variable rain across our Region. Certainly not enough to fill dams or anything of that nature but there is nothing like rain to give us hope. As we approach Easter please be extra careful when driving as it's a bad time for accidents. Have a lovely Easter break.



Pasture Dieback

Pasture dieback is a condition which causes the death of sown and native pastures by affecting plant health and function, reducing the productivity of affected properties. It has been observed in a range of soil types and plant species across Qld and NSW. The condition occurs episodically, with the current outbreak first identified in 2015 and spreading across eastern Qld I subsequent years.

Symptoms of pasture dieback generally occur initially as patches in otherwise seemingly healthy pastures. Be on the lookout for:

- vivid yellowing, reddening or bronzing of the leaves, starting from the tup and progressing down towards the ligule (symptoms develop first on the oldest leaves but eventually spread to the whole plant
- Reduction in root system and grass density
- Plants that become grey and disintegrate once dead
- Plants that become unthrifty and eventually die
- Cattle avoiding affected plants

Initially, patches of dieback are roughly circular, ranging from 2-60mtrs in diameter. These areas can grow irregularly, spreading at speeds ranging from slow (cm2/week in the dryer, colder months) to rapid (ha/week in the wetter, warmer months). Multiple patches can coalesce to form large, dead areas.

Producers have also observed that dieback is most severe in areas of long grass with large amounts of thatching eg. under fencelines or areas of low pasture utilisation



Easter is more than an historical event. It's the focus of the Gospel. But how does such an important historical event as the resurrection have personal connection to you?

The Gospels give us the account of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. It all started in a garden with a man, Adam, disobeying God. Now in this Garden a second man, Jesus, will undo what the first man did.

Luke 22:44 describes Jesus in the Garden, And being in an agony [of mind], He prayed [all the] more earnestly and intently, and His sweat became like great clots of blood dropping down upon the ground. In Matthew 14:33 And He took with Him Peter and James and John, and began to be-struck with terror and amazement and deeply troubled and depressed.

And again in Matthew 26:37, And taking with Him Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, He began to show grief and distress of mind and was deeply depressed. From what you and I know of Jesus these are strong words used to describe Him, deeply depressed, solely grieved, deeply sorrowing almost unto death.

Such a horrible death awaited Jesus on the cross so it's no wonder He would recoil from it. But in a few short years after Jesus went to the cross, people who were called by His name would sing their way to similar deaths dying the death of martyrs.

His death?

In the Garden of Gethsemane Jesus asked twice, My Father, If this cup could just pass from Me (Matthew 26:39, 42). What was it about the cup? There was something about the cup that Jesus didn't want to drink from it.

Jesus and Nicodemus

There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. He came to Jesus by night and said to Him, Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher who has come from God. For no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him.

Jesus answered him, Truly, truly I say to you, unless a man is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.

Nicodemus said to Him, How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born? Jesus answered, Truly, truly I say to you, unless a man is born of water and the

Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, You must be born again. The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit.

Nicodemus said to Him, How can this be?

Issus answered him, Are you the teacher of Israel, but you do not know these things? Truly, truly I say to you, We speak of what We know and bear witness of what We have seen, but you do not receive Our testimony. If I have told you earthly things and you do not believe, how will you believe if I tell you heavenly things? No one has ascended to heaven except He who descended from heaven, even the Son of Man who is in heaven. Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but may have eternal life.

For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world through Him might be saved. He who believes in Him is not condemned. But he who does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God. This is the verdict, that light has come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil. For everyone who does evil hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed. But he who does the truth comes to the light, that it may be revealed that his deeds have been done in God.

It couldn't have just been the nails thrust in His hands, the thorns pushed so deeply into His head, the beatings, the ridicule, the scorn. No, it was what the stripes, the bruises, the thorns represented that made Jesus want the cup to pass from Him...the vilest of sin, all the sickness, mental torment, insanity, depravity, ungodliness in the world.

He had to bear everything that was wrong with humankind. That's what Jesus chose to die for...for us. 2 Corinthians 5:21 For He has been made to be sin for us, who knew no sin, that we might be made the righteousness of God, He became a sin offering for our redemption.

The will of God concerning your redemption, healing, peace of mind and wellbeing was settled forever when Jesus said He would drink of the cup. Do you see why He who had never sinned wanted the cup to pass from Him?

Aren't you glad that He committed to it...But nevertheless not My will but Your will be done (Matthew 26:42)? His was not a martyr's death. It was a substitutionary death. He completely took our place to lift all those things off our lives. No one ever died that kind of death before or since.

He had to experience the fullness of God's judgement and anger so we didn't have to. It was necessary for us to come into relationship with God. That is how much God loves you. Aren't you glad He drank the cup...for you!

This event of Easter is the most pivotal event in our lives...because it changed everything. It is faith in the resurrection that saves us. The Bible says we believe in our heart that God raised Jesus from the dead.

So why couldn't Jesus sing His way to the cross? What was so different about What about you? Have you asked Jesus to be you personal Saviour? If you declare with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved (Romans 10:9).

God bless you as you celebrate Easter!

Jesus came into the world to reveal God to mankind. He also came to redeem everyone to God, so that through Him, all shall be saved and reconcile d to God. If we look at the



history of Australia, it was founded upon God, but since then our love and need for God has declined and grown cold; not only our country but the whole world has

plunged into spiritual darkness. Instead of being thankful and glorify Him for His blessings, some of us pat ourselves in the back saying: "I've done it my way!" Are you still lost?

LIKEWISE, I SAY UNTO YOU, THERE IS JOY IN THE PRESENCE OF THE ANGELS OF GOD OVER ONE SINNER THAT REPENTETH. LUKE 15:10

Last time we considered the parable of the lost sheep, and how that "all we <u>like</u> sheep have gone astray". The analogy of sheep fits so perfectly with mankind. We really are followers & wanderers! We follow other peoples ideas. We often get distracted by what looks better than what we already have, and wander off to find out for ourselves. We get ourselves stuck in situations when we are left to find our own path. What we need is someone to direct us and guide us. For this to happen we need to be found by The Shepherd. We need to be instructed by His guidance, and listen to His words to help us get through life safely. The Shepherd is Jesus Christ. What He has to say is found in the Bible. We must learn to trust his voice, as He speaks to us through the scriptures, because that is where we will find true peace, joy, and contentment. If we've <u>never</u> been found by the shepherd, then we are lost, and heading towards an eternal danger; a cliff edge called death that leads to hell. When we fall, we will forever be separated from the shepherd that wanted to find us and bring us home to heaven with Him. Jesus the shepherd knows this and is looking to find each sheep before it's too late, yet it is up to us to let him know that we want to be found.

Following the parable of the lost sheep in Luke 15, we read the parable of the lost coin. It tells of a widow woman who had 10 pieces of silver, and had lost just one. We read about the effort she puts in, to find what she had lost, "what woman having ten pieces of silver, if she lose one piece, doth not light a candle, and sweep the house, and seek diligently till she find it?" (Luke15:8 KJV). Why does she put in so much effort? Why does she light a candle, and sweep her house? Because what she has lost is valuable to her. She is just like the shepherd that wants to find his sheep. The shepherd looks for his lost sheep because he cares. The woman looks for the coin because it has <u>value</u>. We are the lost sheep and we are the lost coin. God is looking for us because he cares, and because we are of value to him. If you have not yet been found, then you are STILL LOST!

When a sheep wants help it makes a noise; it cries out for help. This is how the shepherd knows where to look. He listens and moves toward the cry. He then not only rejoices because he's found the sheep, but more that the sheep <u>wants</u> to be found. When something shiny is lost, the best way to find it is to wait until it is dark, and shine a light in the places it could be, with the hope that it would reflect that light, thus revealing its location. Then in the places we cannot see, we sweep, hoping and checking for that precious object to appear. This is what God does when he is looking for us. He shines the light of the gospel onto our lives, with the hope that we would reflect back our desire to be found. When we ignore this wonderful story of Jesus Christ (the gospel) He doesn't give up. God still tries to bring us out of our lost place, and into the light. Why? Because he sees every single one of us as valuable. The Bible says after both stories of the lost sheep and the lost coin, that there is joy once when it is found. All of heaven rejoices when one lost soul has desired to be found. When someone has cried out to the shepherd, and has allowed the light of the gospel to reveal their lost state, heaven rejoices. How wonderful that when we turn from the dark lost state we were in, and toward the Saviour and Creator (repent), that Almighty God would rejoice!

Are you lost? Have you considered that you would like to be found, but still resist the Shepherd's voice. Have you heard of the story of Jesus Christ, but still choose to not believe it. Sadly, you are still lost. The cliff edge gets closer every day. Over the edge is death, and hell awaits below if we do not allow the Saviour to find us in time. He cares for you and sees you as valuable. It's our choice to make the sound to be found. (Read John Ch 9:1-7)

Last time we read about a man that may have been able to see before, but had become blind. First Jesus led the man out of the city and then using his spit and his hands, Jesus touched the blind man's eyes and that man got his sight back. Some time after that, the Bible tells us about a time Jesus heals a different blind man. This time we read that the man was born blind. He had never seen anything in his life! He would have had to rely on his touch, sight and smell to live, because his eyes had never worked before. Jesus sees this man, and this time He goes to where the blind man is, spits on the ground and makes some mud. Jesus then puts this mud on the eyes of this blind man, and tells him to go to a certain pool of water called Siloam, and there he was to wash the mud away. Once the man had done this, he was able to see. This was different to the way Jesus healed the other blind man, but it wasn't the way that Jesus used to heal people that was important. Jesus was looking for people to just trust Him to heal them. The first man had to trust Jesus leading him, and the 2nd man had to trust what Jesus told him. Jesus is still looking for people that will put their trust in Him. He wants to lead us by the hand out of our troubles, and help us to see Him clearly. He wants to heal us from the sickness we were born with, called sin, and trust His words so we can be cured from this sickness. Jesus has always been the cure. He wants to open our eyes, so we can see Him. We can see Jesus if we just trust Him to lead us, and trust what He has to say.
