



## **Millmerran Power News**

#### Safety.

Millmerran Team have spent the first quarter of 2023 focusing on the benefits of preventative Health and Wellbeing of our employees. This included a number of information sessions around manual handling including stretching and warm-up exercises delivered by an exercise physiologist. We also made available free skin checks for all



our employees and completed our 2 yearly Audio and Spirometry testing. April saw the commencement of the Queensland Government's new code of practice—Psychosocial hazards in the workplace. In preparation for this, we completed some Mental Health Awareness train-

ing sessions for our employees.



Other interesting activities relating to safety was a dozen of our more daring employees undertaking a snake handling course and our Emergency Response Team completed a heights rescue training in preparation for this years Unit 2 planned outage.

#### Operation

The Millmerran team undertook a strategic review in 2022 focusing on being Safe, Reliable and Sustainable. The key to good reliability is good planning and execution of our outages. To support this we have changed our outage cycle to only having one unit outage each year. Our Production and Engineering team commenced detail outage planning in September 2022 and this planning and activities have been steadily increasing since that time. Early March 2023 has saw a steady increase of our main contractors presence on site working in both planning and preparation work for this years outage. UGL, Howden and GE are our main contractors supporting this outage. The outage commenced on the 29th April and when upon completion will see some 600 contractors completing \$36million of routine and major maintenance works.

#### Genuity

InterGen Australia was recently rebranded to Genuity following the completion of a global demerger with the sale of the UK assets. Genuity intends to maintain InterGen's dedication to delivering flexible electricity solutions and contributing to a stable, dependable energy future. Therefore it is business as usual for Millmerran Power Station.

#### 20 Year Anniversary Party

In March 2023 we celebrated 20 years of commercial operation. This was also my 20 year anniversary with the project. I attribute our success and my long tenure with the great people that make Millmerran Power Station such a good place to work. The anniversary party was a good opportunity to catch up outside of work with both past and present employees sharing stories and the festivities were capped off with a spectacular display of fireworks on a power station backdrop.

#### The Next 20 years...

The team are working on converting the adjacent Mineral Development Licences (MDLs) into the current Mining Lease (ML) by combining them. Expect to hear more about this throughout the year as we secure the coal around the mine for the PowerStation to the end of its design life.



- Block unwanted calls & text messages. Take steps to block unwanted calls and to filter unwanted text messages.
- Don't give your personal or financial information in response to a request that you didn't expect. Honest organisations won't call, email or text to ask for your personal information, like your Centrelink Reference Number, bank account details or credit card numbers.
- Resist the pressure to act immediately. Honest businesses will give you time to make a
  decision. Anyone who pressures you to pay or give them your personal information is a
  scammer.
- Know how scammers ask you to pay. Never pay someone who insists on being paid with cryptocurrency, wire transfer service like Western Union, gifts cards or google play vouchers. Never deposit a cheque and send money back to someone.
- STOP and talk to someone you trust. Before you do anything else, tell someone— a friend, a neighbour, family member what has happened. Talking about it could help you realise it's a scam.

The Student Start-up Loan is an extra \$2402 a year you can borrow while you study. It's paid in two separate instalments of \$1201 as a loan on top of your regular Youth Allowance, ABSTUDY or Austudy Payment.

The second loan period for this year starts from July 1. If you applied when you claimed a student payment, you will be paid in early July. The loan is tax free and added to your HECS-HELP loan. You'll need to pay it back once you start earning a certain amount of income.

#### What to Do with Fear...

It'so good to connect with you through the Newsletter again this month. Let' talk about fear. Everyone battle fear to some extent We don' battle the same fears but we all are faced with opportunities to entertain fear in one way or another.

Psalm 91 will help us. This great Psalm very clearly tells us how to overcome fear. Good news indeed! And it jumps right into it by telling us the habits we're to develop to live in His safety free from fear.

Psalm 91:1 says, Those who live in the shelter of the Most High will find rest in the shadow of the Almighty. God is our shelter. He is the secret place. And here wer'e encouraged to take time aside from the busyness of life so our focus can be on God. It' something we are to choose to do.

Now if you find, as I sometimes do, that when I sit down to read my Bible or to pray, my mind can be racing a thousand kilometres an hour with so much going on. But what I've learnt that has really helped me is to know that God has created us to take charge over our minds, over what we allow ourselves to think. And it' as we put our focus on God and trusting Him to help us, our minds our thoughts are steadied. Why not establish a regular habit of spending time with God, so that when fear tries to confront us, we're already prepared to face it and overcome it. This' so very important...being more focussed on what God says than on what is troubling us.

Verse 2 tells us how to live in God' shelter. His protection, I declare about the Lord: He alone is my refuge, my place of safety; he is my God, and I trust Him. It' in saying who God is to us, we show our trust in Him. If we are not saying, wer'e not trusting. In time of trouble we need to hear God speak. You might say, I wish God would speak to me! Well, He has. The Bible is God talking to you.

If we're not going to give into to fear, it will be because we've learnt to trust God' words more than we do in our own feelings. You speaking God' words will silence fear-filled thoughts. So we've to establish the habit of speaking what God says in the Bible about us and about our situation. What kind of

things? I will say of the Lord, He will rescue me from

every trap, protect me from deadly disease, cover me with His feathers, shelter me with His wings, His faithful promises or His words are my armour and protection (verses 3 and 4). Put it in the first person. Make it personal.

Verse 5 says Do not be afraid of the terrors of the night, nor the arrow that flies in the day. Declare with me, I will not fear. I love that! This Psalm is about being free from fear and walking in God' divine protection. And you will not fear the disease that stalks in darkness, nor the disaster at midday. Keep personalising the whole Psalm as you continue to speak it over yourself.

Notice now the last few verses. These promises the Lord makes to us, The Lord says, I will rescue those who love me. I will protect those who trust in my name. When they call on me, I will answer; I will be with them in trouble. I will rescue and honour them. 1 will reward them with a long life and give them my salvation (verses 14-16). Isn' that powerful!

It' very tempting to give into fear because of all that' going on in our life or happening around us. But this Psalm is a great reminder of the goodness and faithfulness of God. Trust in it. Believe it. And be free of fear.

Let me pray for you, Father God, If any reading this are tormented by fear today free them and help them in walk in Your peace and live in Your safety and protection in Jesus' name. Amen

You speaking gods word will silence fear-filled thoughts




#### JESUS AND THE PARABLE OF THE GOOD SAMARITAN

(Read Luke 10:25-37)

This parable is probably the most well known parable in the Bible. Jesus gave it to a man who wanted to understand who his neighbour was. Jesus told of a man that was robbed and beaten by thieves that stole everything from him, and left him to die on the side of a road. As he lay there a man came past who was a priest. But the priest didn't want to help him. He crossed to the other side of the road, and continued on. Later another man came past, who did the same thing. Maybe these 2 men didn't want to get themselves dirty. Maybe they were in a hurry. Maybe they were concerned about the same thing happening to them, so they didn't want to waste time, and chose to keep themselves clean and safe. Then, a third man came along the road. He saw the injured man, and stopped. He had compassion on this poor man, because he was hurt, and certainly in need of help. This man that was robbed and beaten would have died if no one would stop to help him. This Samaritan man cleaned the man's bleeding wounds, poured healing ointment on them, and bandaged them. Then he placed him on the beast he had, which was maybe a mule, or a camel, and carried that man to an inn. At the inn, the Samaritan was able to take further care of him. They stayed the night there, where it was safe, and he could get a good nights rest, and recover. The next morning the Samaritan gave some money to the inn-keeper, and asked him to take care of the man until he was well. He said, if you need more money, I'll come back this way and repay what you have spent. He was kind, thoughtful and loving.

What a powerful lesson on understanding who our neighbour is. We are to love our neighbours whether we know them or not. The Samaritan was a good neighbour, because he showed love, mercy, and kindness to someone he didn't even know. He went out of his way to make sure that a person in need could get help. Jesus is just like the good Samaritan and we are just like the injured man. We will die in our sinful state, unless we let Jesus find us, and allow Him to give us the healing salvation that we need. We are helpless without the kind hand of Jesus to help us, heal us and guide us to safety. Will you let Him heal you? Then we can be like Jesus and show kindness to our neighbours in need.

#### Psalm 23(continued)

In verse 3 we see two more things that the Shepherd, Jesus Christ, does for his sheep. In the previous verse He made them to lie down in green pastures, and led them beside still waters. Here we see He restores their soul, and leads them in the paths of righteousness. That is four things that show us how a good shepherd will show care for His sheep. Why? Because their life and health mean much to Him. As sheep we are loved.

Many times sheep can get themselves into a situation where they need help from the shepherd. A "cast" sheep is a term given to a sheep that has gotten itself stuck. This can happen when it lays down, and during the time it lays there, it can stretch itself out. As it does, it rolls back a little too far, and it's centre of gravity shifts, and cannot get itself back onto its feet. This might look quite embarrassing for a sheep, with its legs in the air, but there it stays until the shepherd can roll it back onto its legs, get it upright, and get the blood flowing in those legs again. If that sheep doesn't get help while in that position it actually can die within a matter of hours. This sheep needs to be restored! It needs the shepherd to be nearby, and listening so he can run to help this sheep before it's too late. The sheep will struggle. It will flail around trying to fix the problem, but to no avail. Only the shepherd can restore it back to good health, and prevent it from being stuck in its "cast" position.

David the writer, had a time in his life when he was "cast". Not all the Psalms are written in chronological order, and in Psalms 42 & 43 David talks about his soul being "cast down". David had times in his life when he felt helpless; times when he couldn't save himself from a situation, and as a shepherd he could relate to seeing sheep that were stuck, and had no way of fixing their problem. One time in David's life his son, Absalom, tried to take the throne away from his father. David was at a loss. He fled the country to avoid a war amongst his own people and even worse, his own son. It was during this time, David wrote these two psalms, and says 3 times "Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted in me?" He questions himself as to why he feels the way he does. Then each time he writes the remedy "hope thou in God" That was the answer to David feeling so lowly, and depressed. He just had to put his hope in his shepherd. That was where he was going to be restored, and not remain in his gloomy position. David admits that God "is the health of my countenance, and my God". This meant that God was the one that could put a smile on his face again! God was the one that could restore his soul! Later on David was able to reclaim the throne, and as he makes his way back to his kingdom, David writes psalm 23, and pens the words "He restoreth my soul". David was able to sing this with confidence, because he knew what it meant, first hand. He had cried out and God had restored his soul. David knew what it was like to be restored by His Shepherd, when he, as a sheep couldn't do it himself.

How about you? Have you ever been in a position where you cannot help yourself? Maybe you have felt cast down, and in need of help? Have you thought to call out to the Shepherd who is nearby, listening for your cry for help? He wants to be our Shepherd, but are we struggling in our own strength, and only making things worse? Paul wrote in 2 Co 7:6 "Nevertheless God, that comforteth those that are cast down, comforted us...". Praise God we have access to a shepherd that cares for our soul, and wants to restore it. Is He your shepherd? Don't let pride prevent you from asking the Shepherd for his helping hand. Only God can restore our soul, and save us from death.
