We enjoy tending our gardens, including planting, watering and projects requiring the transporting of materials around the yard. It will be very exciting to upgrade our huge vegetable patches later this year.

Our yard brings us peace and relaxation as we laze in the shade of our huge trees, sing songs together on our nest swing, and let our imaginations picture creatures in the passing clouds.

At our daily yarning circle we connect with our hearts and the earth's heart, sharing feelings and observations with each other. We thank the First Nations people who cared for the land and who continue to care for and share their land with us today.

All of these experiences place us well to live out our kindy's vision to care for the land, care for each other and care for ourselves.



Mayor's Report





Firstly, as I begin this report can I apologise for my column not making the last newsletter. I was seriously bedded down with Covid for the first time. I find it amazing that I've not had it before despite constantly mixing with so many people. Particularly during the two weeks I spent in San Francisco, Los Angeles and Vancouver. On return to Toowoomba I had a few short days in our sister city in New Zealand. Despite being at so many airports and destinations I still managed to avoid Covid until now. Puzzling. On Friday 13 May, a Council Officer from my office and I went to board meeting in Brisbane and I was a little throaty but tested negative. The Council Officer tested positive on Sunday and I tested positive on Monday. Given my resistance to the normal bugs and my total vaccination I struggled with being locked up. I rarely get the flu and if I do it certainly doesn't stop me or even slow me down. There is no doubt Covid has brought something to the world that's caused a lot of grief.

Millmerran lost one of its greats with the passing of Aileen Taylor (née Muir). Aileen was married to Brian and together they made a big contribution to the Millmerran community. There were 11 children. It would have been a massive job to nurture and raise them and Aileen not only did that but also gave so much more. She was involved in her church and always portrayed her love for her community and her beliefs. She was heavily involved in many Millmerran Debutante Balls which were the social highlight of our small town's year. The training and ultimately the presentation to the dignitaries created a lasting memory for so many of our young people. While her passing is a sad time, we must be thankful for her selfless contribution. As a community, we will be eternally grateful.

Youth crime is still a major issue for all of us. Local detectives have indicated they know the offenders are a core group of around 20 people which broadens to about 400 across Queensland. It saddens me so few people can have such an impact on all of us. Many older people I speak to live in fear. We have been in conversation with the State Government regarding more support for our disadvantaged youth and it seems like it may be coming our way. As we consider what we can do, please remember our men and women in the Police force who are doing all they can and deserve our respect for their efforts.

As you would know, this is my last term in Council after more than 40 years in local government. I hope in retirement I can still give back to my home community.

I have seen great things in places like Crows Nest where the Nolan Block has been restored beautifully with a coffee shop and successful restaurant that has led to increased commercial activity.

We could replicate this sort of thing in Millmerran. The former railway land where historically sheds stored bagged grain were becoming a park with some suitable infrastructure to reduce the flooding of the main street that would no doubt be helpful. It could be a great central point for Millmerran. Why would we not celebrate our Camp Oven connection with a special museum and a big Camp Oven in a prominent place? The concept put forward in Cecil Plains some years of a giant Cotton Ball also has a lot of merit.


During the past month I went to a special remembrance function in Crows Nest to honour the 74 USA sailors who lost their lives when the HMAS Melbourne was involved in an accident with the USA SS Evans during some exercises in the South China Sea. The rather small 3000 tonne Evans accidentally ran under the bow of the 20000 tonne Aircraft Carrier Melbourne and was cut in half. It was a terrible peacetime tragedy, but I'm pleased my mind was refreshed. We do truly owe so much to people who have served and are serving our great nation.

It has been a busy period for Council with our budget coming down. It has a 4% rate increase and a total spend of \$651 million. Of concern is the enormous amount of money to be spent on getting Cressbrook Dam up to the latest ANCAL standards. The total cost we estimate will be in the order of \$200 million. That's our total yearly infrastructure spend so there may have to be some serious cuts elsewhere in the years to come.

The winter has certainly arrived and it's nice to see the beautiful greenery of the emerging crops. Recent rain has been beautifully timed and also beneficial. I have been talking to those involved in the new Millmerran pool and things are moving along well for a possible opening in late June. Thank you all for your patience. The new complex will be a great community asset as was the previous one. I look forward to being at the opening.

Mock Orange - Seedling Grown Form



Murraya paniculata (seedling grown form) Trees and Shrubs Queensland South West

The compact rounded strate which glossy green foliage grows to a height of 3-5m. The plant produces highly perfurned white flowers in terminal clusters in Spring, Brough to Autumn. The flowers are followed by small eval bright orange red bening which are highly attractive to back.

This very popular garden plant has asveral forms. The seeding grown form, popular in the 1970's, is to be avoided as it is invasive. Gardens in older suburbs are likely to have this undestable form and removal is recommended.

HOW IT SPREADS

- The orange-red berries are nightly destable to brids whose droppings ensure this plant is independed in bushland. Large colories and bridshing as created emothering natural wegetation and inflating ecosystems.
 Do not purchase Munaya from non-regulable suppliers as they are shelp to be seeding grown forms.



God's Got Me Covered!

Great to connect with you once again through the Newsletter, Millmerran! And isn't our Newsletter looking impressive. Full colour and all. All credit to the Newsletter Team who work so tirelessly to bring it to us every month.

This month I've titled our chat God's Got Me Covered. If you asked me, what can I say about God after all these years of loving and serving Him, I'd tell you God is faithful! He's got me covered and can always be counted on.

And I know this same God who got me this far, will take me the rest of the way. In 1 Thessalonians 5:24 we read, He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it He's been faithful to strengthen me, to keep me and to sustain me. And in every step I've taken, I've found God to be faithful, worthy of my trust.

People judge God all the time. They blame Him for everything that goes wrong, they judge Him as the cause of every natural disaster and every bad thing that happens to them. It's God's fault, you'll hear many say.

But I love in Hebrews 11:11 that Sarah, Abraham's wife, judged God faithful. Sarah had faith in the faithfulness of God, By faith Sarah herself also received strength to conceive seed, and she bore a child when she was past the age, because she judged Him faithful who had promised.

In the Old Testament God made a covenant with Abraham and Sarah. He was faithful to them and to those who came after them. And Israel grew into a mighty nation. Yet one day they went into slavery for over 400 years because of their disobedience, their unfaithfulness, to God.

They forgot their God, forgot their covenant with Him. Yet when they cried out, God heard them and set a plan to deliver them. What I love is that even though they weren't faithful to God...God was faithful to His promises, His covenant, with Israel. Israel forgot God but God never forgot Israel.

In Deuteronomy 7:9 Moses is reminding the people,

Therefore know that the Lord your God, He is God, the faithful God who keeps covenant and mercy.... Does God change? No, He doesn't. He's always the same. He is always faithful.

Throughout the Old Testament we repeatedly see God's faithfulness at work. What about in the New Testament? Philippians 1:6 is such a powerful verse it says, I am confident of this very thing, that He who has begun a good work in you will complete it... God will be faithful to you. He will complete what He started. I'm so thankful God is a good finisher. He's not just a good starter, He's also a good finisher.

The Apostle Paul told Timothy, If we are unfaithful, he remains faithful, for he cannot deny who he is (2 Timothy 2:13). If He said it, He will do it. If He promised it, He will perform it. If He started it, He will finish it. God is faithful.

When Paul wrote this, he was nearing the end of his life. He was ready to be martyred. 2 Timothy is last letter Paul wrote and what was his testimony of God in his life? What is it he wants to remind us of? That God is faithful...always faithful!

You can trust God. He has got you covered! The God we love and serve, the true and living God, is a faithful God and that means He will be faithful to you through the difficulties and challenges of life.

You can put your faith in God alone, even when your knees are knocking, knowing He will be faithful to you. He is the Lord who is present. The Lord who is here. He will never leave or forsake you. That's part of His incredible faithfulness.



Psalm 23_(continued)

Last month we considered the first part of this verse "he restoreth my soul:". How that when we feel cast down we need to be restored like a sheep does. It is the one that we have made to be our Shepherd, God himself, that can and will do this for us if we would cry out to Him and allow him to restore us, as he sees fit.

The next part of this verse lists the 4th thing that God the Shepherd does for His sheep, "...he leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake". David understood that the path that God takes his sheep on is a righteous one. Any path that God takes His sheep along will always and only have right and good things along it. God is never going to lead his sheep into any situation that He as the shepherd can't lead them out of. God has His name on His sheep. They belong to Him. It is for the sake of His name that He makes sure that every sheep has every opportunity to get through any hard road, difficult situation, or trial, if that sheep would simply listen to His voice, and obey His instruction to get out of the trouble. In Jeremiah 6:16, it says "Thus saith the LORD, Stand ye in the ways, and see, and ask for the old paths, where is the good way, and walk therein, and ye shall find rest for your souls." The old paths are well worn, and are proven to be safe for the sheep. The old path is a good way that leads to rest. The old path is the way that the Shepherd walks, and He goes in front of His sheep. He isn't going to let His sheep step in a place that He isn't going to step in himself.

We live in a world that likes change, and likes to change things just because they are old. It seems that people just don't like rules, and want to be their own authority, so they make their own rules by changing the old ones. Sadly this will never work, because if those old rules are the old paths that the Shepherd wants his sheep to walk along, it is the only good way. Changing the old path is making your own path. If we make our own path, then it won't be the one that the Shepherd is walking on, and He won't be close by when the sheep get into trouble and need Him. It won't be a good path, and it won't lead to rest. But, sadly, this mindset is nothing new. Man has never wanted to follow God's way since the garden of Eden. All through the Bible we see God encouraging mankind to stay on His old path; to follow His righteous path, and avoid the dangers of straying. When we stay on the righteous path we are obeying the voice of the Shepherd, and prove we trust His voice above all else. Pro 16:25 says "There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.", but Jesus says "Lam the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me." Who are we going to trust? Who are we going to follow? The old paths written in the Word of God from the voice of the Shepherd? Or new paths written by man who thinks he knows better than his creator?

As individuals with sheeplike tendencies, we are responsible for where we end up in life. Ultimately we make the choice every day to follow the old path, or make our own path. God has given us the old book. He has preserved it in the most popular language of the day, so that all mankind have the opportunity to read and understand the voice of the Shepherd. Praise God for the old book and the old faith. May we not get tangled up in the changes that our current world want to make to suit their agenda and desires, and ignore the paths of righteousness that God wants to lead us all on. History tells us where that leads. The Bible tells us the results of those that trust in their own reason than to humbly follow the one who "leadeth me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake". Psa 118:8 It is better to trust in the LORD than to put confidence in man.



This was the point Jesus was hoping they would realise for themselves.

Jesus was teaching them that <u>everyone</u> is important. Jesus was like a shepherd that cared for all His sheep. Jesus loves everyone the same regardless of how much they love Him back. But, how can people know of the love of God, if godly people look down on them and treat them differently. What a precious lesson for us all, even today. We need to remember to not treat people badly because they are sinners. We can dislike the sin, but never the sinner. We are all sinners. We must, like Jesus the Shepherd, show the love of God by letting them know that Jesus loves them, and died for their sins. God doesn't want anyone to stay lost, but wants every person to come home to where Jesus lives. When a sheep allows Jesus to find them, rescue them from sin, and save them from eternal death, to take them home to heaven one day... there is joy in heaven because that sheep is saved! Have you?
