September, 2023 newsletter update.

Here we are in September already. The Gore Highway is still being worked on which I am sure is a frustration to regular travellers and of course all the truck traffic. With the damage to the road on either side of these roadworks, it seems we may be held up for some time yet as hopefully they will continue with their rebuild.

At the August MCPI meeting, we welcomed guests Katie Unipan and Majella Doyle from ARTC, along with Amy Crowley, Ben Williams and Maria Vazquez from Genex which is the development company of the Bulli Creek Clean Energy Park (Solar Farm). Their attendance was to address our members with updates on these projects. Both companies gave members great insight to where their projects sit and informed the meeting that Bulli Creek construction is set to begin by August 2024 with a proposed 600 man camp. Dependant on approvals Inland Rail could begin in early 2025 with a 300 man camp. These camps could be based in Millmerran and both companies are in discussions with each other as to what will work best. It has been advised that there will not be a construction camp built on the proposed Turallin site. Construction of the Captains Mountain Wind Farm could begin construction by 2026 subject to development consent.

It was timely that the Darling Downs Regional Alliance group held their second meeting of the year in Millmerran the day after our August meeting. Seven Councillors including the Mayor and Deputy Mayor attended along with three key staff. The Alliance incorporates the townships of Toowoomba, Clifton, Pittsworth, Crows Nest, Highfields, Yarraman, Oakey and Millmerran. These meetings are always well attended by Council, and it is a great opportunity for open and honest conversations involving each of our communities.

The top of Millmerran's list this month was to give Council an update on each of the above projects and make them aware of the concerns we have regarding our roads, emergency services and housing, to name a few. With the potential of such a large influx of people, there will need to be strategies in place to handle this and MCPI shall have ongoing involvement in these discussions.

Please note that the MCPI AGM has been scheduled for Wednesday 18 October at the Catholic Church Hall, William Street, Millmerran 5.30pm for a 5.45pm start.

The next MCPI meeting will be Wednesday 20 September 2023 at the Catholic Church Hall, William Street, Millmerran – 5.30pm for a 5.45pm start.

NSW/Qld Border to Gowrie

Proposed workforce accommodation locations

Inland Rail's NSW/Qld Border to Gowrie (B2G) project is preparing additional information to support the revised draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

The project's draft EIS included three proposed workforce accommodation sites – Inglewood, Yelarbon and Turallin. Following feedback during the draft EIS public exhibition in 2021 and a site feasibility study, Turallin will not be included in the revised draft EIS as a proposed workforce accommodation site.

Turallin will be included in the revised draft EIS as a potential miscellaneous construction facility, material laydown area or training facility.

Sites in Inglewood and Yelarbon will still be considered for workforce accommodation in the revised draft EIS.

We will work with the community once the project is approved to identify a preferred location for a workforce accommodation facility in the Millmerran area. Any proposed facility will contribute social and economic value to the community while minimising the potential for adverse impacts on the local community.

The project's revised draft revised EIS will be subject to a period of public exhibition following submission to the Coordinator-General (CG), which will be determined by the CG.







We're preparing for school each day at Kindy

It's been exciting to start visiting our prospective primary schools for next year and to meet some of the teachers there. Every day at Kindy, we're preparing for primary school—not by learning the alphabet and how to read and write (that's what school is for), but by building our emotional regulation, self-care, social and problem resolution skills, coupled with a passion and curiosity for learning.

We're developing strong coordination between our fingers, hands and eyes when we undertake woodworking, mix mud concoctions in the cubby and twist the machine to make tasty carrot noodles—this prepares us for learning to write at school.

When we sit with friends and share a book by turning the pages, looking at the pictures and adding our own words or when we play with rhyming words and make up songs, we are demonstrating pre-literacy and language skills that are significant building blocks towards us being ready to learn to read at school.











Supporting school readiness

- Talk regularly with your child about the experiences they might engage in, the friends they will make, and the interesting things they will learn
- Encourage them to put on and do up their own shoes, and carry their own bag
- Walk past the new school from time to time to encourage familiarity and conversation about school
- Encourage eating and drinking without help—support your child to wrap and unwrap food and fill up their drink bottle themselves
- Share and discuss positive experiences from your own school days
- Show where you will pick your child up each day, and explain what to do if you are late
- Talk about staying safe at school, as there may not be child proof gates
- Attend the school's Open Day and meet your child's teacher
- Find the Prep classrooms, bag lockers, play areas, toilets, lunch spaces and drink bubblers together
- Reassure your child that if they are unsure of anything, to ask an adult

Mayor's Repor





As the newly appointed Mayor of our Toowoomba Region, I'm honoured to feature in this edition.

It's been quite a busy month at Council with the retirement of our long-term Mayor Paul Antonio and the subsequent appointments of myself as Mayor and Rebecca Vonhoff as Deputy Mayor, with the process of bringing a new Councillor on board also in motion.

This is the first edition in many years our former Mayor has not written this article and in his absence, I would like to pay tribute to Paul for his outstanding service to the community.

He leaves behind a remarkable legacy. To have served for close to 42 years is an amazing achievement and one which may not be seen again in local government in this Region.

While his final years in local government was with Toowoomba Regional Council, his journey first began as a Councillor on the Millmerran Shire Council, and he has always held a special place in his heart for this part of the Region.

Paul was a staunch advocate for Millmerran, and the surrounding areas, and was pleased to see a new aquatic centre being built for the community.

The final works and testing for the aquatic centre are expected to be completed in the coming weeks, in time for the official opening of the new centre, which is scheduled to take place in September.

This is a great project for Millmerran and the wider Region, with the facility featuring a new outdoor 50m pool, a toddler pool with beach entry with zero depth splashpad and water features.

The aquatic centre will be accessible for people with disabilities and includes a wheelchair access ramp into the 50m pool. New facilities on site include change rooms, a kiosk building, showers and amenities.

I'm sure the community will get great use out of this asset for many years to come.

Over the past month Council began consultation for the 2024-2029 TRC Corporate Plan.

This is an important document which outlines how we plan to support a safe, healthy and engaged Region. This will also drive planned growth throughout the Region over the coming years.

Council is also encouraging residents to have their say on the North-South Transport Corridor which is being proposed by the State Government.

Council agrees there is a growing need for a road for the Region and remains committed to advocating for minimal disruption to our residents while achieving a suitable outcome for the residents.

Residents are encouraged to lodge submissions to the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR) by 8 September 2023.

Members of the public can provide their feedback in the following ways:

3. Visiting TMR's website and online consultation page at https://www.yoursay-projects.tmr.qld. gov.au/toowoomba-ns-transport-corridor

It's important to note that TMR will be the decision maker in the final outcome. However, Council will advocate for the interests of our residents during the assessment and consultation process.








Bushfire Safety in the Bush

We've had a great season of cool burning, protecting multiple properties, and therefore the people, flora and fauna that exists on that land. Seeing as the cool burning window is coming to a close and, after a wonderfully wet year last year creating plenty of growth, there is a risk of unplanned fires but there are still ways to lower risk of wildfire.

Simple steps include- ensure tracks are wide enough to get vehicles inc firetrucks and water trailers down.

-remove fuel loads around structures (leaves in gutters, long grass, etc). Slashing is a good way to keep fuel loads down, including small thickened species such as wattle and pine.

-rake around large trees to prevent any low burning flames from climbing up bark, as well as removing any dead timber piled against base or leaning on trunk or branches -remove any thickened vegetation. This sort of vegetation creates ladders for fire to creep up higher. Hand removal is very effective as well as slashing and mulching. These can easily be piled up and burnt in small 2 metre x 2 metre piles

-store as much water as possible, whether in dams or tanks. -get to know your neighbour, Having a great neighbourhood is priceless, especially in times of need.

If you've got old xray films lying around, drop them off at the Landcare office to be sent away for recycling.

Don't forget we also recycle pens and markers, printer cartridges, batteries, toothpaste tubes and toothbrushes


Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and thy staff they comfort me. Psalm 23:4

Psalm 23 (continued)

Many times in the Bible we will find words like, "walk", "walking", and "walketh". Most of them are always instructing us in a spiritual context. This proves that God cares about how we walk spiritually through life. The many references ensure we walk closely to Him on the path of spiritual safety, without fear. There are too many to note here, but here are a few... "walk in

love" (Eph 5:2), "walk worthy of God" (1 The 2:12), "walk by faith" (2 Cor 5:7), "walk honestly" (1 The 4:12), "walk in wisdom" (Col 4:5), "walk in truth" 3Jo v4), "walk in the light" (1Jo 1:7), "walk <u>not</u> after the flesh" (Rom 8:1&8), and "Blessed is the man that walketh <u>not</u> in the counsel of the ungodly" (Psa 1:1). Now, there may have been a physical place called the "Valley of the Shadow of Death", but David is not necessarily referring only to this. From a spiritual perspective this verse gives us comfort in a literal sense. If a person has repented of his sin, and trusted the blood of Jesus Christ to save from the punishment of his sin, he need not fear the things that those without Christ fear. If we are following the steps of Jesus by allowing Christ to be our example (1 Pet 2:21), then by our faith in Him, our fears can be put to rest. The voice of the Shepherd will be our greatest comfort in our fears, because whatever He says is true and right and good for us. When we try to walk our own spiritual path outside of the Word of God we will struggle to follow the voice of the Shepherd.

These verses go well together and guide us to walk in spiritual safety, without fear "O LORD, I know that the way of man is not in himself: it is not in man that walketh to direct his steps." (Jer 10:23), "The steps of a good man are ordered by the LORD: and he delighteth in his way." (Psa 37:23), "The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide." (Psa 37:31). When fear comes, do you rely on the law of God in your heart? Are you familiar with the voice of the Good Shepherd, because you have a relationship with Him? We are told to follow Jesus, and are unable to direct our own steps. When we try to, we easily slide, and slip into fear. We must keep the law of God in our hearts, and follow Jesus. Walking with Him brings delight, comfort, and safety.



The Father's Heart!

Happy Father's Day to all the Dads out there. And I'm including all the mentors who along with Dads tirelessly invest into the lives of children and young people for good. We thank God for you.

When I think about a father's love I think of the Father of all fathers. Father God Himself. And He desires to be a Father to us...every one of us.

God desires to have a personal relationship with us. Yes, He really does. So, for us to know for ourselves the love God has for us is huge. Why? Because it is difficult at best to have a relationship with someone you think might leave you at the first sign of trouble or at the first mistake you make.

Life today can be very performance oriented. But God's love doesn't come to us through OUR performance. His heart for us is nothing like that. His love expressed so powerfully through healing, restoration, deliverance and provision doesn't come to us through our performance but through HIS. God's love for us was settled once and for all when Jesus died for us as us so He could be our Father.

God's love is a love that is so contrary to how most love... You love me and I'll love you. But God's not looking at you to determine whether or not He's going to love you.

So we are so much better served looking at Him and the way He loves instead of always looking at ourselves and what's wrong with us. We have to know God's love for us knows no limitations, no seasons, no boundaries. Through every failure, every endeavour, His love for us is steadfast and unfailing. His love for us is empowering.

Despite our less than perfect performance, God's love for us has never wavered. He has never even considered giving up on us. He will not fail you. He cannot fail you in His love.

When I think of the Father's love toward me, 1 Corinthians chapter 13 verses 4-8a comes to mind. Have a look at it. We usually call this the love chapter and for so long we've looked at it as a *to do* list for us. Thinking these are the things we have do or to be like for God to love us. But I believe what these verses are really showing us is what God's love for us is like. This is how God loves us. Our Father's love is loyal, committed. He is incredibly patient, never shames or condemns us, never finds delight in our mistakes or shortcomings. He's not holding anything against us. He believes the best of us never the worst of us. He never stops loving us.

Jesus said if you've seen Me, you've seen the Father (John 14:9). Jesus was saying, you've heard what God has done in the past and you need to know who He is...well, look at Me. The Father's heart is no different from Jesus' heart. Colossians 1:15 speaking of Jesus says, *He is the image of the invisible God.* So if you want to know what God is like, we just have to look at Jesus. And we don't ever see Jesus sending cyclones or earthquakes. We don't ever see Jesus putting sickness on someone to develop their character or to teach them a lesson.

What we do see in the person of Jesus is that every storm He encountered He calmed. Every sick person who came to Him, without exception, He healed. See that's the heart of the Father.


