










Great Achievement for our local Swimmer







Mayor's Report





MAYOR 0423 MDN SEC TRC

Youth crime has been a massive issue of late, not only in Toowoomba but right across the Region and our State. As you would have seen, there was a forum in Toowoomba attended by the Police Minister Mark Ryan, as well as local senior police officers and the Police Commissioner. There was considerable discussion by the public with our residents sharing their own experiences. People have had enough of the actions of a small group of young people branded LND which I understand means 'Life and Death' and you may see these letters on buildings. My understanding is that this small group of people are committing most of the crime and because of their age and the current judicial rules there seems to be less severe consequence for their actions.

I recently had the Premier in my office to discuss what action could be taken to improve things. The Premier undertook to make the necessary changes and to work with us to give some of the unguided youth better guidance. I think we all understand there are some youths who have a difficult life at home and feel as though they are better off on the street than in a disruptive home. With the strong financial and staff support of the Queensland Government, I would like to see us form a group representing all sectors who can help build better pathways. In addition to this, providing the rehabilitation required. Parenting is also another matter which needs to be addressed. We've all experienced crime in our lives but not at the current level. We must work together to reduce it.

It was an honour to be at the launch of the Western Clydesdales rugby league side as they re-entered the State competition. The team is being supported by the Canterbury Bankstown Club who have long been established in our national competition. The Clydesdales have an amazing history. As a child I was fortunate to see them play in the Bulimba Cup against Ipswich and Brisbane. I also recall seeing them defeat New Zealand, the British and in a bloody game, the French. There is some history that we can be proud of. The rebirth of the game at this level will be great for the community. It was so good to spend time with a highly-regarded Millmerran boy, Blake Cullen, who will now have an opportunity to play at a higher level. It bought back those wonderful memories of the time when our local A Grade side was dominant in the Toowoomba Rugby League. Those two premierships in 1981 and 1982 were history for our community. There Cr Paul Antonio has been further discussion regarding the upgrade

of the Clive Berghofer Stadium, historically called the Athletic Oval. The State Government is expected to make the announcement soon to cater for the possibility of potential preliminary football events for the 2032 Olympics.

Last month I reported on the trip by the Council of Mayors from SEQ to San Francisco, Vancouver and Los Angeles and during the past month I also had the pleasure to visit Whanganui, our Sister City in New Zealand. The relationship started 41 years ago and while there are no serious trade benefits to either party, the relationship is a great one and I feel it is important to continue strengthening this partnership. There is a new Mayor and a number of new Councillors I'd not met so it was great to make new connections. Whanganui is a community of less than 50,000 people and truly is a beautiful place with a magnificent river flowing through the area. It's interesting seeing the development of the port going ahead as it's so necessary given the North and South islands need the freight connectivity. Whanganui has a lot of beautiful areas with beautiful natural park areas. The idea has long been on the table for the establishment of an Australian garden over there and a New Zealand garden here in Toowoomba. I am hoping to progress that as soon as possible.

I was saddened that due to my travel commitments I could not attend the Millmerran Show for the first time in many years, possibly since I was a small child all those years ago. I did attend the Cooyar Show and for such a small town the crowd was absolutely amazing, principally due to the enormous number of horse events.

During the month we had a special animal memorial ceremony in Newtown Park remembering the contribution of various animals to our war effort. There are some amazing stories of their contribution and I need to thank my long-term colleague for her passion for the remembrance and the beautiful memorial we have in the park close to our famous rose garden.

A Yarning Circle is a place to share conversation, designed to allow everyone to have their say in a safe and respectful place.


Knowledge can be passed on through stories, art, song and dance.





A Very Happy and Blessed Easter!

We all want change in our lives to some degree or other. And I truly want God's Word to become so real to you that the love and power of God will reach into your life and bring the changes you want. There's no better time for us to talk together about that than Easter because Easter is all about the possibility of change.

I want to wish you a happy and blessed Easter from my heart to yours. Yes, we can look at Easter from an historical perspective...and it is. But if we only see it as an historical event, we miss the personal interaction God wants to have with us. If Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever (Hebrews 13:8), let's put ourselves in this event and see how He'll interact with us because He is alive.

Jesus died. He wasn't temporarily dead...He died. It looked like it was over in the hearts of those closest to Him. And in that horrible death He paid the price for our sin, for our sickness and disease and lack. Don't ever think lightly of the things Jesus went through. He was without any sin but He took all that for you and for me. And make no mistake, God counted every iniquity, every sin, every way we would miss it. He counted it all and laid it all on Jesus.

It's no wonder when Jesus was in the Garden of Gethsemane He prayed, O My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; nevertheless, not as I will, but as You will. (Matthew 26:39). He wasn't just talking about the physical pain He would experience on the cross. He wasn't just talking about the physical beating or the horrible death He'd be subjected to. He was talking about the weight of sin that would be laid upon Him, a sinless man...and be separated from God the Father who He'd never been separated from since the beginning.

This isn't just about a gruesome death...It's about the greatest act of love ever.

Luke 24:1-6 talks about the women going to the tomb after Jesus's death, Now on the first day of the week, very early in the morning, they, [a] and certain other women with them, came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared. 2 But they found the stone rolled away from the tomb. 3 Then they went in and did not find the body of the Lord Jesus. 4 And it happened, as they were greatly perplexed about this, that behold, two men stood by them in shining garments. 5 Then, as they were afraid and bowed their faces to the earth, they said to them, "Why do you seek the living among the dead? 6 He is not here but is risen!

The angels couldn't figure out why these women would bring spices to embalm the body of someone who is not here but is alive. Do we recognise Him as the resurrected risen Lord, or do we only see Him in an historical way...the One in the gospels who healed the blind man, healed the leper, the lame man? Oh, I'm thankful we have those records of how He was anointed of God and went about doing good healing all who were oppressed of the devil for God was with Him (Acts 10:38).

But Jesus is now the risen, conquering Lord. He conquered hell and death. Hell could not hold an innocent man and had to release Him as He rose from the dead. The punishment that you and I deserved had been paid. The Saviour had arisen and to those who would believe in what He did for them would be saved. This isn't just about a gruesome death. It's about the greatest act of love ever.

2 Corinthians 5:19 AMPC declares, It was God [personally present] in Christ, reconciling and restoring the world to favor with Himself, not counting up and holding against [men] their trespasses [but cancelling them], and committing to us the message of reconciliation (of the restoration to favor).

Because Jesus is alive, it ought to make a difference. I pray this Easter you are drawn back to God in a whole new way.



JESUS AND THE PARABLE OF THE RICH FOOL

(Read Luke 12:13-21)

One day a man asked Jesus to help him with a family problem. The man had a brother that wouldn't share with him the wealth and riches that the man thought he deserved, so he asked Jesus to speak to his brother for him. But, instead of Jesus going to speak to the brother, He gave this parable to help the man with a problem that the man didn't even know he had. Jesus told him a story about a very rich man that had a very big crop. There was so much grain and fruit that the rich man had no place to store it all. This was because his barns and store houses were already full. So, he had an idea. He thought the best thing that he could do would be to pull down his barns and storehouses and build bigger ones. That way he would be able to store all of his goods. He thought that if he could keep it all, he would be able to enjoy being rich and do nothing for many years. But then God spoke to him. God said to the rich man that he was a fool. God told him that tonight is the night you will die, and then who will own all your grain and fruit and riches? He was so greedy that he was foolish, and was only thinking about life on earth and not his eternal future. What could the rich man have done with his extra wealth? He could give it to someone who needed it! He was already rich, so why try to get even richer? It had made him so foolish, that he was not thinking about making sure that he was ready for eternity. It is good to remember that our life doesn't end at death. The Bible says that after we die, our life will continue either with God, or without God. With God is a place of peace, contentment and joy, and without God is a dark and lonely place, where there is pain

Psalm 23 (continued)

Last month we got half way through 4 things that will prevent a sheep from lying down in true peace and contentment. In our pictures above we have the first 2 verses of this Psalm, and we see a sheep that's gone from standing up, to lying down in a green pasture. David, the writer of this Psalm and a sheepherd, was speaking from experience. He knew what it was like to live with God as his sheepherd. David had a sheeplike relationship with God and knew the benefit of being led by God through life. He had experienced the wonder of being spiritually filled, content, and at peace. Any child of God can have this, because all saved have access to God through Jesus Christ, who also is called the Good Shepherd. In Psalm 23 we are the sheep, and we ought to follow God by faith and allow Him to lead us. The 2 things we looked at last time were Famine and Flies. Sheep can't rest if either are bothering them. If we as sheep are spiritually starving ourselves from the rich sustenance of the Word of God, then it will be very difficult for us to find sweet rest. Likewise if we have something bugging us, annoying us or niggling at our conscience, we'll struggle to find the peace and contentment that comes by allowing the shepherd to calm our thoughts. Jesus said "Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls." (Mat 11:28-29) Coming to the shepherd, is where we'll find rest. This is how He makes us lie down.

- 3. <u>Friction</u> Sheep cannot rest well if there is conflict with other sheep. Like most herd type animals there is a butting order; for chickens there is a pecking order etc. When a sheep has a position in the flock, it has to work at maintaining it. Do you know how much easier it is for a sheep that is at the bottom of the order? Sure it will have to keep it's distance. It might have to wait a bit longer to get a drink, or some food, but when it rests there is no fear of another sheep wanting its position. When we are experiencing friction with another person, it can bother us, and we can't find rest in certain parts of our life. Butting heads with people really just hurts ourselves and others. It is far better to take the humble road, because it is certainly hard to sleep with a headache! "But godliness with contentment is great gain." (1 Tim 6:6) It is a great gain to sleep or rest in contented peace.
- 4. Fear Sheep cannot rest well if they're afraid of something. The best defence sheep have is to run. They get startled very easily, and often the whole herd will run, without even knowing what they are running from. We too can let fear rule our lives, and fear can rob us of lying down in peace. Do you know what brings instant calm to a sheep in the dark when they are afraid? The sound of their shepherds voice! What comfort it is to hear from God's words when we are afraid of something that He can so easily take care of. "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." (2 Tim 1:7) It is not God who gives us our fears.

Four things - Famine, Flies, Friction, and Fear. I'm sure there's more that can and will prevent us from being made to spiritually lie down in the green pastures that the Shepherd has led us to. If you cannot claim that God is your Shepherd, then maybe you suffer from some of these things. Even as Christians we can be guilty of allowing these things to disturb our sheeplike relationship with God. What can we do? Feed on the Word of God. Give our worries over to the Shepherd.
