

Welcome to the Millmerran Newsletter, May edition. Thank you to Roselle Crellin and Julie Crang for once again expertly publishing another full newsletter that truly is a great resource for our community each month.

Have you seen the flags hanging from the Millmerran Community Support Centre? We have recently purchased Easter and Anzac Day flags which add some extra atmosphere to Campbell Street. Speaking of which, our main street is looking particularly spectacular with beautiful hibiscus flowers blooming from the 21 TRC pots plus all the extra baskets of colour along with the lovely chrysanthemums planted for Mother's Day. Thank you to the volunteers who keep these pots colourful and well loved.

It is great to see the streets of Millmerran being resealed with new bitumen and the Gore Highway roadworks continuing. The delays are going to take some getting use to again however the removal of the cracks and potholes in the road will be welcome.

During the month of April MCPI representatives attended a Community Network Forum for the Millmerran Sports Centre as well as the Millmerran Multipurpose Health Service Community Forum. The Sports Centre discussed overcoming barriers of inclusion and ways of keeping the community involved in activities undertaken at the centre. The hospital representatives gave us a detailed presentation on what the new facility will look like with a timeframe to begin construction in 2024. We have asked Darling Downs Health to supply MCPI with regular updates to keep our community informed of progress.

On Tuesday 18 April, I attended a TRC Councillor deputation with Chamber of Commerce representatives from Toowoomba, Pittsworth, Highfields and Crows Nest. We were able to bring forth two topics of concern from our area and I spoke of the overland flooding issue as well as the increase in library hours to five days per week. These topics have been raised with them before and we hope by mentioning them again, it will show our level of concern.

The next MCPI meeting will be Wednesday 17 May 2023 at the Catholic Church Hall, William Street, Millmerran – 5.30pm for a 5.45pm start.

Little Tackers Childcare Centre Millmerran

From 10 July 2023, there are changes to the way Child Care Subsidy (CCS) entitlement is worked out. Your Childcare will be cheaper for most families.

What you need to know

The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90% for families earning up to \$80,000.

The income limit for CCS is increasing to \$530,000.

If you earn over \$80,000, your CCS percentage will go down by 1% for each \$5,000 of income your family earns.

You'll either get more subsidy or have no change to your entitlement. The CCS percentage you're entitled to depends on your family's income. For more information about CCS, go to servicesaustralia.gov.au/ changes-if-you-get-family-payments.

Families with more than one child aged 5 or under from 10 July 2023, if you have more than one child aged 5 or under you can still get a higher rate for one or more of your children. If you get Additional Child Care Subsidy (ACCS) your rates will stay the same.

What you need to do from January to June 2023

In most cases, you don't need to do anything to get the increased rate. If you get CCS, changes to your CCS will change automatically from 10 July 2023.

Updating your family income estimate

The amount of CCS you get is calculated using your family income estimate. It's important to make sure that you check your income estimate regularly and update it if your circumstances change. If you get CCS or if you're already assessed for CCS but get 0%, you may be eligible for an increased rate. Check your family income estimate is up to date so you get the right amount from 10 July 2023

You can check or update your income estimate at any time using - your Centrelink online account through my.gov.au or you're your myGov app If you have any questions, please call the Centre.



Mayor's Report





The month of April just gone is a special month of our year as we see the change in weather and the deciduous trees begin to see the leaves fall. My Toowoomba home is in a street with lots of deciduous trees and the four seasons are most noticeable.

This time of year to me is a time of remembrance. We've just seen ANZAC commemoration services across our region and it is a time to be thankful for the freedoms we share in this great country. My recent travel with the Southeast Queensland Council of Mayors group to the United States and Canada, as well as New Zealand, has certainly reinforced that in my mind.

We do owe so much to those who fought in all wars but in my mind is the Pacific War which was a critical part of the Second World War for our nation. Had Australian troops not succeeded with the help of our Allies the world would be a very different place.

Anzac Day to me represents a day to remember all those people who gave so much. Many of them faced very difficult situations and so many lives were lost and so many families impacted. They left us an amazing legacy and let's be thankful. I certainly recall some amazing neighbours my family had. They came soon after the war ended and bought land, worked hard, expanded their holdings, had families and played a positive role in our community.

It's also a time when we should remember all those who served and in my mind I can't help think of the Vietnam War and the period when many young men were conscripted. It was interesting because I was a student at what is now UQ Gatton and we would regularly talk about the efforts to preserve the freedoms we have. Many young men of my age group were conscripted and after twelve months of preparation were sent to Vietnam for 12 months and were then discharged with very limited support. The impact on many of those people was horrific and a big percentage were changed forever. A number of my college friends who were conscripted were badly impacted. I hope on ANZAC Day we always remember the sacrifices made that preserved the wonderful freedoms we have in this amazing country.

Each month we have Citizenship ceremonies and for me personally they are a wonderful experience. Some of the stories are truly amazing with people, particularly from the Middle East, having gone through terrible trauma. The suppression of females in some of these cultures is horrific. Many of these people, particularly the young ladies have opportunities they would never have experienced in the place of their birth. The school captain this year at Toowoomba State High is a young man of the Yazidi cohort from the Middle East who has been here six years in which time he's learned our

language and worked hard in all areas to get to where he is. Every Australian family has a story of how they started and, while it's not possible, I often think how good it would be to be able to have a conversation with the original members of our families as to why they did what they did. Australia has always been a land of opportunity for new arrivals and it's no different in this era.

There is still a lot of work going into the 2032 Olympic Games and the possibilities for our region. Toowoomba Regional Council continues to advocate for a Centre of Excellence for Equestrian at the Toowoomba Show Grounds. Further to this, it recently occurred to me that there is only one serious Animal Quarantine Centre in Australia at Tullamarine in Melbourne and as such we should look at having one at the Wellcamp Airport. I took the subject up with the Premier when she was in my office and also the operators of Wellcamp and it appears that all parties are working together to make it happen. No doubt Federal Government agencies will play a major part in the delivery. The 2032 Olympic model is all about leaving legacies and this certainly fits those criteria.

It's been a busy month with initially a gathering of Statewide Regional Organisations of Councils (ROC's) in Toowoomba for their annual conference. Roc's are a strong advocacy tool for councils and both levels of government would prefer to meet ROC's than Individual councils.

Toowoomba had a visit from both State and Federal politicians during the month who were invited to talk about the needs of our region and the funding of projects and the general lack of external funding in the broader Local Government context.

Interestingly a Highfields-based drone company called Swoop has been established to deliver products, particularly medicinal products to the more remote regional areas in the TRC when they are required urgently. No doubt you'll hear more of that in the months ahead.

The announcement regarding a new modern hospital for Millmerran is great news.

It's so good to see the rain come back after a dry period and let's enjoy the beautiful green grass and the lovely Autumn change. It's a special time of the year.







JESUS AND THE PARABLE OF THE BUILDERS


(Read Matthew 7:24-27)

It is always sad to hear the terrible news about people who lose their belongings in flood waters. Today's parable is about a flood that washed away an entire house! One day Jesus spoke about 2 builders who built houses on different types of foundation. A foundation is what something rests on, once it has been built. For a house to stand strong and firm in a storm or flood waters, it needs to be built on a strong foundation. These two builders built their own houses, and while one decided to build on rock, the other decided to build his house on sand. The house built upon the sand would have been easier to build, as the foundation was soft to dig into, but the man who chose the rock to build on would have had to work a lot harder. One day a storm came, and the flood water rose high. The house built on the sand was washed away, just like our sand castles do at the beach when the waves reach it. The man who built his house on the rock was safe though, as it was built on a strong foundation. It was safe through the storm, when the wind blew, and the floods pushed against it.

Jesus was teaching his followers, and us as well, that our lives need to be built upon Him. Jesus is the strong foundation for our lives, but we need to choose to build our life upon Him. Jesus had just finished a long talk to all the people that were listening to Him, and He had taught them many things about how to live life the best way, which is the way that pleases God. At the very end of his talk, He gave them this parable, and said that those who listened to all the things He said, and did them in life, were just like the wise man who built his house upon the rock. The wise man made the right choice, He had put in the effort and was safe when life got hard. The foolish man took the easy way, and he is like someone who may hear Jesus but does not live how Jesus instructs us to. When life gets hard, he won't have the wisdom to get through life safely, and will struggle, and lose many things that are important to him. So, the lesson for us is, that we must be like the wise man and build our life on the things that Jesus teaches us to do, from the Bible. That is the only way we will get through life safely when the storms of life come, and the water gets deep. A life built upon Jesus will last to the end.

Psalm 23(continued)

Sheep prefer to drink from still water. They don't like rushing streams, rapids, or turbulent waterfalls. It is a gentle flowing stream, or a pond that they'll go to if they have the choice. The shepherd knows this, and it is this medium of water, to which God will lead His sheep to. He knows the needs of His sheep, and knows how to bring the peaceful things into their life that will keep them in that state of peace. When a sheep is patient, and continues to follow its shepherd closely, it will be rewarded with the peaceful still water, it prefers. This is water that is clean, pure, available and will sustain the sheep, at the right time. However, when a sheep gets impatient, or doesn't want to follow the shepherd; when it wanders off, or strays, thinking it knows best, it will drink from the first muddy puddle it finds. Maybe a puddle that has the filth of the other sheep in it. Possibly that puddle holds the bacteria and disease that will make that sheep ill, and weak. The shepherd did not lead the sheep to that muddy puddle. It was still water, but not the clear, clean water that the shepherd had in store.

Herein lies the lesson for us. We are the sheep, and God is the shepherd. God will lead the way, but we have to commit to following faithfully. If we follow Him closely, obeying the sound of His voice, and stepping where He steps, we will be rewarded with exactly what is good for us. We will find the spiritual contentment and peace pictured by the green pastures, and the cool clean waters that we would much prefer to enjoy. But then, there are the sheep that maybe don't have a relationship with the Shepherd. Maybe a sheep that knows who the Shepherd is, but doesn't want to follow Him closely. One that would rather walk a path that he thinks is best, and being distracted by the world, and what it has to offer, he'd rather enjoy the pleasures of a life of "freedom". Beware, the thirst will still come! There is a spiritual hunger and thirst in everyone of us that can only be satisfied, and sufficed by the shepherd. God is trying to lead us, and make us to lie down in the green pastures, and beside the still waters. But, when we are not near Him; when we have strayed from Him, that hunger and thirst will be fed by the filthy puddles of the world, and the unsatisfactory food that society says is good, but it will never satisfy our needs. We will get ill. The sickness that lust, and wickedness, and carnal knowledge gives, will weaken us against the spiritual attacks of the devil, and we will fall into his tricks. As we try to satisfy our spiritual hunger with the wrong food that has no substance, our hunger will increase, and we will swallow more and more of the unhealthy varieties of distasteful filth that we have chosen to include in. All we had to do was follow. All we had to do was obey, and stay close to the shepherd. What went wrong? Why has life become meaningless? Why has life become such a mess? It is because we were too stubborn to give up our will over to the will of the shepherd, and walk in His steps. If we have faith in the shepherd that never leads us astray, that always tells the truth, and that will never let us down, we can be assured of finding peace and contentment. We can be led to a life where our spirit can be filled, because we are feasting in the spiritual pastures from where He says to feast from and because we are drinking from the spiritual waters from where He says to drink from. We can then lay down amid the troubles that come because we have faith that God, the Shepherd, has got this. Praise God that He is a shepherd that is willing to lead us, love us, and limit us from that which is not good for our spiritual life. Do you have a life with the Shepherd? Is He leading, or are you? "And when he (Jesus) putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice."
